Fellow Legionnaires: We are now into our 4<sup>th</sup> month of renewing Post Memberships for the 2008 Legion Year. In addition, calls to the Holding Post 297 members who have indicated they would like to transfer to Parkville Post has been on-going.

As I prepare to submit this article to our Editor, Jerry Coleman, I will give you an update on our membership totals. As of October 4<sup>th</sup>, Parkville Post has 2,466 members in our books. We have reached approximately 74% of our membership goal (3,337). Hopefully, with the 2<sup>nd</sup> dues notices going out to unpaid members, renewal activities will pick up.

Addressing the renewal notices, I have received several phone calls from members recently who unfortunately have gotten renewal notices although they had paid their dues. Some ground rules: Thanks for paying your dues and being an Early Bird; if you receive one of these notices, it probably has a note stating that if you paid your dues, ignore this notice; and if you have in your possession your 2008 card, then obviously you paid your 2008 membership dues and you are a current member in good standing. Any questions, call me.

Your 2008 Dues may be paid on any Tuesday evening, 7:00 - 8:30, or at any regular Post Meeting. Of course, you may use the U.S. Mail or the Internet as another option.

Finally, a review of the Paid Up For Life (PUFL) program: there is a Rate Chart that calculates a members current age along with the dues for this Current Year which will equate to the PUFL cost. In addition, arrangements may be made to pay the PUFL fee on time payment: 10% down, then 12 months to pay the balance. To the spouses reading this article, the holidays are coming and if you are undecided on a gift, consider a PUFL.
