William Samuel Scrogins (G60) was a son of Benjamin Scrogin (F45) and Pamelia (Pamela) Bohannon of Shelby County, Kentucky. Although the family name has been spelled Scrogin, Scrogins, Scroggin and Scroggins, William Samuel signed his will Scrogins and his father Benjamin signed his will Scrogin. A letter written to Benjamin by his father John in 1850 was addressed and signed Scrogin. Mary Edna Wade, who was known as Edna, was a daughter of William Wade and Louisa Crook Johnson.

William Samuel Scrogins (G60) fought for the Confederacy during the Civil War as a cavalryman. A record of his enlistment and service has not been found but before 16 September 1862 he was an active participant, captured by Federal troops, paroled with the stipulation that he not bear arms for the Confederacy until freed by a prisoner exchange and finally released in a prisoner exchange on that date. William S. Scroggins, a private in Jesse's Independent Cavalry, appears on three lists:⁴

List of prisoners of war released on parole not to serve in the Armies of the Confederate States, until exchanged, at Cumberland Gap, Tenn., Sept. 15, 1862. List dated near Cumberland Gap Sept. 15, 1862.

Register of Prisoners of War at Cincinnati, Ohio. Captured in Ky; exchanged Sept. 16, 1862 by Genl. Morgan for a soldier of the U.S.A.; who had been captured in Kentucky. Cincinnati, Ohio, Register No. 1; page 148.

List of Confederate officers and soldiers exchanged at Cumberland Gap, Tenn., September 16, 1862. List not dated.

Jesse's Independent Cavalry, which also may have been known as Jesse's (Jessee's) Battalion, Kentucky Mounted Rifles, was a part of Morgan's Raiders, led by General John Hunt Morgan, who campaigned in Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio and Indiana. Captain Jesse was described as a huge and dependable man.⁵ Perhaps William Samuel Scrogins served in Company A, Jesse's Battalion Mounted Rifles with some of his kinsmen and neighbors. Captain George M. Jesse (Jessee) was mustered into service on 22 July 1862 in Owen County, Kentucky. 2nd Lieutenant Frank P. Stone, 1st Sergeant Leroy Kesler, 1st Corporal Noble Onan (O'Nan), Private W. H. Bohannon, Private Samuel Marion and others were mustered in at Shelby County on 25 August 1862. The unit saw action on 27 July 1862 at Mt. Sterling, Kentucky, when two men were reported wounded. William Samuel Scrogins could have been captured at this time. Since Morgan's men were devoted to him and the rebel cause, perhaps, after his exchange, William Samuel Scrogins rejoined the famous fighter for the duration of the war. The timing of his marriage in 1865 may indicate that he campaigned with Morgan until the brilliant leader was killed in September 1864 before returning home. On the other hand, after his combat experience, capture and parole, perhaps he returned home to Shelby County to stay. As required by law, he was enrolled in the Kentucky State Militia of Shelby County during the years 1862-1865 which may or may not indicate actual continuous residency.

William Samuel Scrogins and Mary Edna Wade were married at the home of her mother when he was 23 and she was 18 years old. The ceremony was performed by T. M. Daniel, Minister of the Gospel, and witnessed by Walter Beckley and John Miles. Miles also was security on their bond:⁷

We, the undersigned, are jointly and severally held and firmly bound unto the Commonwealth of Kentucky in the sum of \$100, to be made and levied of our respective goods, chattels, lands, and tenements, and for the use of the Commonwealth, upon the condition that there is no lawful cause to obstruct the marriage of William S. Scrogin and Miss Mary E. Wade. Given under our hands and seals this 20 day of January 1866.

This gives the age of Mary Edna as 18 but, having been born on 21 May 1849, she was only 16 in January 1866.

William S. and Mary E. Scrogins were enumerated on the 1870 census [1870 Federal Census, Kentucky, Reel M593-498, Shelby County, Jacksonville Precinct, Dwelling 7, Family 7, e-mail data of G. F. Scroggins 23 Aug 2001.]:

On 27 February 1871 William S. Scrogin and Mary E. Scrogin his wife conveyed to Newton Miles for \$2310.80 one-half interest in a tract of land in Shelby County on the waters of Six Mile Creek which was bounded by the road from Jacksonville to Consolation and the lands of H. Harrod, S. F. Harrod, Whiteman heirs, Jesse Johnson heirs, and R. Dodson containing 101 acres and 91 poles, subject to the annuity of Samuel Miles and wife. The deed was signed W. S. Scrogin and Mary E. Scrogin and sealed. They acknowledged it in Shelby County Court on 10 May 1871.⁸

The farm of William Samuel Scrogins was close to Jacksonville in the Jacksonville Precinct of Shelby County near the North Benson Hills. The crossroads village was 13.8 miles northeast of Shelbyville, 3.7 miles from Bagdad and 2.7 miles from Consolation. The area is bounded on the east by the Franklin County line. Indian Fork Baptist Church is on the road from Consolation to Jacksonville.⁹

W. S. Scrogins served as auctioneer in the estate sales for H. J. $Montfort^{10}$ and for Rebecca Bohannon on 10 September 1887. 11

William Samuel Scrogins was recalled by his family as being a successful farmer who was very kind-hearted. Reputedly, he co-signed many notes for his neighbors and sometime repaid the loans on their behalf. Perhaps he just did not speak about it but there is no family tradition about his Civil War experiences, so his service may have been brief. When he died on 21 January 1905, his newspaper obituary did not mention his military history either:¹²

Death of W. S. Scroggin

Mr. William S. Scroggin died at his home near Bagdad last Saturday, aged sixty-eight years. Mr. Scroggin had suffered several severe attacks of heart disease, and the last proved fatal.

Mr. Scroggin was a Christian, useful citizen, esteemed by his neighbors and by many throughout the county, which he once served as Deputy assessor.

Besides his sorrowing wife, he leaves two daughters, Mrs. Lillie Cox and Mrs. Myrtle Kesler, of near Bagdad; and one son, Mr. Benjamin Scroggin, of Louisville.

The funeral services were conducted at "Indian Fork" by Rev. W. E. Powers, of Todd's Point, and the interment was in the church burial ground.

The will of William Samuel Scrogins (G60) was made on 13 August 1903 and proved in Shelby County Court on 13 February 1905. He did not write it himself. His signature was shakier and the script slightly different: ¹³

I W. S. Scrogins of the County of Shelby and State of Kentucky formuly declare this to be my last will and testament. first, I give and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Scrogins all my personal estate Stock household and kitchen furniture farming utincils and all moneys cash notes and accounts of which I may die possessed after the payment of my Just debts and funeral expenses Second, I bequeath to my beloved wife Mary E. Scrogins the sum of (\$250.00) Two hundred and fifty dollars it being the amount of money She advanced to me out of her father's estate to will it or spend it as She see's proper. Third, I bequeath to my wife Mary E. Scrogins all land or lands that I own at my death during her natural life then at her death the Said land then is to be divided among my three children or sold as agreed between them with the exception of Two hundred and fifty dollars I have willed my wife out of said land

mentioned in this will to do as She pleases with. The balance to be equally divided among my three children namely Lillie M. Cox Myrtle F. Kesler and W. B. Scrogins or their heirs and assigns and last I hereby constitute and appoint my said wife Mary E. Scrogins to be my executrix without bond and with power to sell, convey and make deeds to any and all real estate that I may die possessed of This my last will and testament revoking and annulling all former wills by me made and ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my last will & testament In witness whereof I have hereunder set my hand this the 13th day of August 1903

After the death of her husband, Edna Wade Scrogins lived with her son Banie for a while until she decided that she wanted to move into Parr's Rest, a Baptist retirement home for ladies in Louisville on Cherokee Road at Highland Avenue. In order to be accepted by Parr's Rest, Edna, with the agreement of her children and heirs, signed over all of her estate, real and personal, to the home. Identified as Mary Edna Scroggins, she died there on 06 May 1924 from arteriosclerosis due to senility, aged 74 years, 11 months and 5 days. The certifying physician, E. L. Henderson, M.D., who had attended her from 01 January 1922, last saw her on the day of her death. She was described as a white, female widow who was born in Kentucky. Her parents were William Wade and Louisa Johnson (Johnston), both natives of Kentucky, according to the informant, W. B. Scroggins, 215 West St. Catherine Street, Louisville. She was buried at Shelbyville on 08 May 1924 by Schoppenhorst Brothers of Louisville. She was buried beside her husband at Indian Fork Church in Shelby County. Their tombstones read: 15

John Cox, Jr. who married Lillie Scrogins (H68) was a son of John Cox and Elizabeth Harrod. He was born on 04 January 1866, died on 16 April 1953 and was buried on 18 April 1953. Lillie May Cox was born on 04 January 1867, died on 12 March 1930 and was buried on 14 March 1930. 16 She died at the age of 63 years, 2 months and 8 days from myocarditis and apoplexy at 1100PM on 12 March 1930 at Bagdad Precinct No. 1, Shelby County, Kentucky. The attending physician, D. Wilhoit of Bagdad, treated Lillie from 25 February 1930 until her death. The duration of her illness was given as 1 year and 6 months. She was buried at Bagdad Cemetery on 14 March 1930 by G. W. Sacrey, undertaker, of Bagdad. Lillie was described as a white, female, married housewife by the informant, John Cox of Bagdad. She was born on 04 January 1887 in Kentucky to William Scroggin and Edna Wade, both natives of Kentucky. The typist misspelled her father's name as Scroggim.¹⁷

Earl Wade who married Mary Cox was a son of Enos Wade and Mollie Facker. Enos Wade was a son of Obediah Wade and Eusebia Cook; Obediah Wade was a son of Anderson Wade and Mary "Polly" Ann Johnson. Anderson Wade was a brother of William Wade and an uncle of Mary Edna Wade. Polly Ann Johnson was a sister of Louisa Crook Johnson who married William Wade and an aunt of Mary Edna Wade. 18

Walter James Kesler (H138) who married Myrtle Scrogins (H69), as she always spelled the name, was a son of Thomas Dudley Kesler and Rachel Ann Miles (G105), who had fourteen children. Walter was born on 21 April 1868 in Shelby County, Kentucky, died on 01 December 1941 at Shelbyville, Shelby County, Kentucky, and is buried in Bagdad Cemetery. ¹⁹

Walter J. Kesler obtained a bond to marry Myrtle F. Scrogins (H69) in Shelby County on 07 March 1892, with W. H. Botts, Jr. as surety. It was the first marriage for Walter, who was 24, a farmer of Franklin County, Kentucky, where he had been born. His father was a native of Franklin County, Kentucky, and his mother was born in Shelby County, Kentucky. It was also the first marriage for Myrtle, who was 18, a native of Shelby County, Kentucky, as were her parents. They were married by J. T. Sampson at the residence of her father William Scrogins in Shelby County on 09 March 1892 in the presence of David Cox and William Botts.²⁰

Identified as Myrtle Scroggins Kesler, aged 89, Myrtle died at 420PM on 07 November 1963 at Kings Daughters Hospital, Shelbyville, Kentucky, from a stroke that occurred one week previously. Her physician, who had been treating her since 1960, was Donald Chatham. She was buried on 09 November 1963 at Bagdad Cemetery, Bagdad, Kentucky, by Hall-Taylor Mortuary of Shelbyville. Myrtle was born on 21 March 1874 in Shelby County, Kentucky, to Will Scroggins and Mary Edna Wade. She was described as a white, female, widowed homemaker who lived at 313 Washington Street in Shelbyville by the informant, Gayle Kesler. 21

Hattie Neville Martin who married Leonard Kesler was a daughter of William H. Martin and Mildred Wade. She was born in Shelby County, Kentucky, on 06 March 1899.²² Mildred Wade Martin was a daughter of Obediah Wade and Eusebia Cook and an aunt of Earl Wade who married Mary Cox. After his death an obituary for Leonard Kesler was published in the Shelbyville newspaper:²³

Leonard C. Kesler, 79, retired farmer of the Bagdad community, died at 9 p.m. Jan. 21 at the King's Daughters Hospital following a long illness.

Mr. Kesler was a son of the late Walter James and Myrtle Scroggins Kesler, a member of Indian Fork Baptist Church and a Navy veteran of World War I. He and Mrs. Kesler had been married 52 years.

Mr. Kesler was a gentleman of many fine traits of character, chief among them was loyalty to family and friends.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Hattie Martin Kesler, three brothers, Gayle H. Kesler, Shelbyville; Selbert Kesler, Rushville, Ind.; and Frank Kesler, Charlestown, Ind.; three nieces and one nephew.

Funeral services were conducted at 2:30 p.m. Monday from Hall-Taylor Funeral Home by the Rev. Herman Bowers and the Rev. Tom Kinman. Burial was in the Bagdad Cemetery.

Pallbearers were Walter Peyton, Garnett, Danny and Wesley Newton, Vernon Johnson and Thurston Brewer.

Mary Pauline Marion, who married Charlie Kesler, was a daughter of Charles Abraham Marion and Susan "Susie" Cook. She was born on 19 December 1895 in Shelby County, Kentucky, died there on 21 October 1939 and is buried in Bagdad Cemetery.²⁴

Her sister Sarah Cook married Abraham Kesler, perhaps a brother of James W. Kesler. Pamelia Bohannon Scrogin, mother of William Samuel Scrogins (G60), was a daughter of William Bohannon and Jane Wilcoxson. Jane Wilcoxson Bohannon was a sister of Frances Wilcoxson Cook and a daughter of Daniel Wilcoxson and Sarah Faulconer. William Bohannon was a son of John Bohannon and Helen Cook. As Mrs. Emily Hopper, she married (2) Allen Webster on 23 December 1868 in Shelby County with Henry Clemons as bondsman.

Rachel Ann Miles who married Thomas Dudley Kesler on 25 October 1849 in Shelby County, Kentucky, was a daughter of Abraham Miles and Irene Scrogin (F71). Robert Montgomery was surety on the bond. She was born on 11 August 1833 and died in February 1910.

Sarah "Sally" Cook, who married Abraham Kesler, was a daughter of Seth Cook and Frances Wilcoxson. ⁴⁰ William Prothero was bondsman for Abraham Kesler (Kester) and Sally Cook, daughter of Seth Cook, when they were married on 06 October 1815. ⁴¹ The date of their marriage also has been given as 03 October 1815. ⁴²

Abraham Kesler lived in Franklin County, Kentucky, in 1820.⁴³ He moved to Henry County, Kentucky, before his son Leroy was born.

When Leroy Kesler married Sabinia N. Onan on 24 January 1856 in Shelby County he was described as of Henry County, Kentucky, aged 25, born in Henry County. Sabinia was described as of Shelby County, Kentucky, aged 20, born in Shelby County. Clempson Onan was surety on the license.⁴⁴

Abraham Kesler died before his daughter Juliann Kesler married William H. Reed (Reid) on 13 August 1838 in Shelby County, since her guardian then was J. C. Steedman. John Davis was bondsman.⁴⁵

Abraham Kesler died intestate in Shelby County, Kentucky, where the inventory of his estate and its settlement and division are recorded. Distribution of his estate on 27 January 1846 went to heirs Jefferson Kesler, Lemuel Kesler, Leroy Kesler, Henry Kesler, Elizabeth Kesler, Juliann A. Kesler, S. A. Reed, and the widow Sally Kesler. Since James was not listed he must have died before his father. Henry and Elizabeth may have been children of James. S. A. Reed must have been a child of Julia Ann Kesler Reed (Reid). 46

Elizabeth Stratton who married Lemuel Kesler on 29 January 1852 in Shelby County was a daughter of William Stratton. H. H. Stratton was bondsman. Lemuel was security on the bond for Martha Stratton, daughter of William Stratton, deceased, when she married Dudley Neal on 13 October 1854.⁴⁷

Nancy Cook who married James Kesler and Sarah Cook who married Abraham Kesler were sisters, which supports the probability that James and Abraham Kesler were brothers.

Another brother may have been Lewis Kesler (Kester), who married Elizabeth Fought, daughter of Leonard Fought, who secured the marriage bond, on 23 April 1823 in Shelby County.⁴⁸

Nancy and Sarah Cook were daughters of Seth Cook and Frances Wilcoxson. Seth Cook was a son of William Cook, Jr. and Margaret Jones who came to Kentucky from Henry County, Virginia, before 07 June 1788. William Cook, Jr. was a son of William Cook and Ann Griffith (Griffin). Margaret Jones was a daughter of Robert Jones and Mary van Meter who moved to Halifax County, Virginia, from Frederick County, Virginia, before 1752.⁴⁹

Frances Wilcoxson Cook was a daughter of Daniel Wilcoxson (Willcockson) and Sarah Faulconer. Daniel Wilcoxson came to Kentucky from Rowan County, North Carolina, in 1776 to be with his uncle Daniel Boone. He was a son of John Willcockson and Sarah Boone. Sarah "Sallie" Faulconer Wilcoxson was a daughter of John Faulconer and Joyce Faulconer who came to Kentucky from Spotsylvania County, Virginia, in the fall of 1779. Joyce Craig Faulconer was a daughter of Taliaferro (Toliver) Craig, Sr. and Mary "Polly" Hawkins. Polly Hawkins Craig is famous for leading the women to the spring for water during the Indian siege of Bryan Station. ⁵⁰

Helen Cook, daughter of William Cook and Margaret Jones, married John Bohannon and had William Bohannon who married Jane Wilcoxson, daughter of Daniel Wilcoxson and Sallie Faulconer. William Bohannon and Jane Wilcoxson had a daughter Pamelia Bohannon who married Benjamin Scrogin (F45), brother of Irene Scrogin (F71) who married Abraham Miles, and had William Samuel Scrogins (G60) who married Mary Edna Wade.⁵¹
