Joseph Scrogin (C1) was a son and heir of John Scrogin (B2) and Jane Clarke of Charles County, Maryland. Sarah Ann Caldwell was a daughter of John Caldwell, Jr. of Somerset County, Maryland, and his wife Mary, whose maiden name has not been determined.

The birth dates of the children of Joseph Scrogin (C1) were written in his family record, which originally was inscribed in a book. Parts of the right margin of the page are missing, resulting in the loss of some dates. A note written in 1892, apparently to William Hayden English (G80) from his daughter Rosalind English Walling (H116), to accompany the family register, states that it was copied from a book possessed at one time by John Scrogin (D2). Another transcription of the register includes the missing dates:³

July 18th

My dear Pa

Send me the letters as Will never answers any directed to me and he can see them later. I am looking now for the Grigsby genealogy written ten or twelve years ago. I do hope this old paper of Granny Boone's father's will not be injured. Levin Polk Scrogin Banker of Lexington Ills's the owner & he was a long time getting willing to entrust it to me. He is a grandson of John, Granny Boone's eldest brother, who inherited the book from which this record was taken. I don't know where the book is.

Your aff. Daughter

The date, Jul. 18, 1892, was noted, parenthetically, in the upper right corner of the letter, in a different handwriting, and a notation in a third script appears in the upper margin:

This paper was returned to Mr. Scrogin at Lexington Ills. July 26/92 by W.H.E.

The register was in another hand:

My will is That my Son John Scrogin have this book and it is not to be apraised my Estate

This registry of the children of Joseph Scrogin (C1) gives the birth year of Samuel Scrogin (D5) as 1748, but in a deposition in 1819 Samuel declared, "from my Father's record I was born in January 1749." This indicates that this list was a transcription of the original, which is substantiated by a second copy of the record. Inscribed Books of Divinity are mentioned in Joseph's will dated 05 September 1772, so the original family record must have been in one of them, written before the will in 1772 and after the birth of Matilda (D13) in 1766. Since he was 56 when he wrote the record, this gives the

parameters for the birth year of Joseph Scrogin (C1) as 1708 to 1716. Sarah Caldwell Scrogin must have been born around 1720, because she was 50 when she died between 1764 and 1772.

Written in yet another hand, a list of the births of the children of John Scrogin (D2) was added to the bottom of Joseph's record:

The day date for the birth of John Scrogin (D2) disagrees with the first list and with another copy of the birth register, that was made in 1892, from the papers of Thomas Davis Scrogin (F44), son of George Scrogin (E11) and grandson of Samuel Scrogin (D5), which were possessed then by an unidentified descendant in Farber, Missouri. It contains all of the birth years, including the correct year of 1749 for Samuel (D5), but shows a contradictory month for Ann (D11) and day for Matilda (D13):

The children of Joseph Scrogin (C1) and Sarah Ann Caldwell must have been born in Somerset County, Maryland, which was their only known residence.

Joseph Scrogin (C1) was incorrectly identified as the son of Captain Joseph Scrogin, an Irish naval officer in the service of King Philip V of Spain who fell in love with Philip's daughter Princess Fantalena. He rescued her from a tower, where her father imprisoned her to prevent the romance, and they eloped to England, where they were married. In 1714 they emigrated to Maryland, bringing land grants, diamonds, gold snuffboxes and other jewels. They settled at Snow Hill in Worcester County where Captain Joseph Scrogin, Sr. died. At some time, during an argument, the tempestuous Fantalena threw some valuable land grants or deeds into a fire, thereby reducing the affluence of the family. Their only son Joseph Scrogin, Jr. was born in 1715 and married Sarah Ann Caldwell in 1740. Reflecting the high temper and passion of his combined Irish and Spanish blood, Joseph Scrogin, Jr. was described as being a self-willed and uncontrollable youth who fell out with his mother and left home, refusing to speak with her further or to submit to her control. It was said that even the taming yoke of matrimony could not cool his fiery nature. This romantic family tradition, perpetuated by its publication, may be based on some facts, but it is fundamentally false. Philip V did not have a daughter named Fantalena, which is not a name found in the Castilian language. King Philip V had three daughters who married European royalty. Maryland court records prove absolutely that Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County, Maryland, is the son of John Scrogin (B2), who was a son of George Scrogin (A1) of Charles County, Maryland. A death date of 31 December 1770 is given for Princess Fantalena Scrogin, but it is likely that date applies to Sarah Ann Caldwell Scrogin, according to the family register of Joseph Scrogin (C1).

The tradition of Princess Fantalena has its source in the person of the grandmother of Joseph Scrogin (C1). Circumstantial evidence indicates that his mother Jane, the wife of John Scrogin (B2), was the illegitimate child of Fantalena Joy by George Clarke. The origins of Fantalena Joy have not been determined. Although she was not a recognized daughter of King Philip V of Spain, Fantalena Joy may have a royal or noble background and perhaps she was first married to an Irish sea captain, but she was never known to have been married to a Scrogin.

Joseph Scrogin (C1) did leave his Charles County family home for some reason. He crossed Chesapeake Bay and established himself near Salisbury, in Somerset County on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, in or before 1740, when he married Sarah Ann Caldwell.

His personality and demeanor must not have been too erratic for him to win the approval of her father, who was a prosperous businessman of Salisbury. By his 1747 will, John Caldwell, Jr. left two saw mills, part interest in a sloop, a landing house and a number of other houses in Salisbury to his heirs. Caldwell thought enough of his son-in-law, Joseph Scrogin (C1), to make him a legatee and to appoint him as a trustee of his will. 10

Contrary to tradition, Joseph Scrogin (C1) apparently left home in good favor with his parents, because his father John Scrogin (B2) bequeathed the two tracts of land that he owned in Charles County, called Harrisons Venture and Scrogins Grove, to Joseph, his eldest son, who was described, by a memorandum to the probated 1743 will, as living on the Eastern Shore. Later in 1755, in a complex legal proceeding involving several parties, a man named Hencock Jones sued Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County for the two tracts of land, Harrisons Venture and Scrogins Grove, which Joseph had inherited from his father. These documents prove that Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County was the son of John Scrogin (B2) and his wife Jane of Charles County.

On 10 October 1743 Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin acquired 179 acres of land in Somerset County called Fairfields. John Henry of Worcester County, assigned 100 acres to them, from a tract of 400 acres for which he held a warrant, and the province granted the additional 79 acres. The parcel adjoined a tract of land named Stanes (Stains or Stones) that belonged to William and Thomas Hern, near the head of Wicomico River: 12

The Fairfields tract acquired by Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin may have been the land owned by Richard Stevens from about 1680 until he died in the fall of 1713. Stevens' land named Fairfields was situated in the fork of Rockawalkin and Wicomico rivers, lying east of the Rockawalkin and north of Wicomico River. 13

Wicomico River is now known as Wicomico Creek and Rockawalkin River is now known as Wicomico River. Today, Wicomico Creek ends at a dam near the village of Allen, southwest of the town of Salisbury. The lake behind the dam is fed by water from Barkley Branch and Passerdyke Creek. Wicomico and Passerdyke creeks form the boundary between Somerset and Wicomico counties. State Road 529 crosses the dam. A watercourse named Collins Gut empties into Wicomico Creek and there is a community named Polk Landing on the south side of Wicomico Creek. The creek is a wide stream, bordered largely by marshy land. Cooper Road, which circles through the territory from Allen to the Upper Ferry on Wicomico River, below Salisbury serves the area of land within the fork of Wicomico River and Wicomico Creek today. There is a place named Collins Wharf on Wicomico River, above the point where Wicomico Creek enters the river. To compound the complications of the name changes, there is a Rockawalkin Creek between Upper Ferry and Salisbury, that runs south to join the present Wicomico River.

Thomas Pemberton had 900 acres called Fairfield surveyed to him on 02 February 1682 in Wicomico Hundred of Somerset County in a fork of Wicomico River, which was later possessed by William Whittington, Jr., that might have been the land subsequently owned by Joseph Scrogin. 14

John Caldwell, Jr., the father of Sarah Caldwell Scrogin, made his will on 11 July 1747, naming his sons-in-law, Joseph Scrogin and William Venable, as trustees to supervise the administration of his will. As the legacies of his daughters, Mary Venable and Sarah Scrogin, he gave his sons-in-law permission to use the mill to saw 12,000 feet of plank each and to have help in sawing and carting the wood. His other legatees were wife Mary Caldwell; sons Joshua, John and Samuel Caldwell; grandson John Handy and Mary Handy, whose relationship to the testator was not described. Monies due from Captain George Paris (Parris) and Doctor Jackson, income expected from a cargo sent by Captain Paris, proceeds from the sale of his quarter-part of a sloop and profits from his mills were assigned to pay his debts. Wife Mary and youngest son Samuel, who was not 21 and indentured to Robert Mills, were appointed executors. Colonel Robert King and Captain Henry Ballard were named as advisors to the trustees. The will was proved on 19 August 1747. ¹⁵

Joseph Scrogin (C1) sued John Hearne for trespass in September 1752 and, with the consent of both parties, the case was entered into record as agreed. 16

On 15 September 1755 Hencock Jones of Queen Anne's County, Maryland, sued Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County for possession of two tracts of land in Charles County; Harrisons Venture, containing 50 acres, and Scrogins Grove, containing 31 acres. The legalistic verbiage appears to be a standard format of the court and does not explain the basis for the controversy or how Joseph Scrogin disposed of his inherited land. He apparently sold it to someone, after which the title became clouded. Several parties were involved in clearing the title. Joseph was ordered by the Provincial Court, through the sheriff of Somerset County, to appear in Provincial Court at Annapolis in October 1755, which he did. Hencock Jones claimed that Hugh Hunt had improperly disseized him of the property. Richard Goldsmith, the tenant at the time of the suit, testified that Hunt did not disseize Hencock Jones of the lands. Joseph Scrogin defended his right of inheritance to the lands and gave warrant that Goldsmith was the proper possessor. Hencock Jones persisted and returned to court during the same term, but Richard Goldsmith failed to appear and was found in contempt, defaulting his bond. Joseph was then ordered to quit claim the lands in favor of Jones and to recover his loss from Goldsmith. The problem probably was caused by Goldsmith or Hunt, who were involved in the same roles in a similar case with other principals, including Nehemiah, Philip and Eleanor Covington, which ended with the same result. 17

Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin were members of Rockawalkin Presbyterian Church. On 23 April 1759 they were listed as renters of Pew 21 with Joseph Whittington. The fee paid by Joseph Scrogin was one pound and that by Joseph Whittington was 16 shillings. Rockawalkin Presbyterian Church was in the part of Somerset County that became Wicomico County and the church was known later as Wicomico Presbyterian Church. Other members of the congregation who were, or whose families were, otherwise connected with Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin and their families, included Jas. (Jos.?) Caldwell, Wm. Caldwell, John Case (Cope?), Rob't Hall, Day Givans, William Venable, William Venables, Jr., Jos. Venables, Benj. Venables, Benj. Venables, Jr., Durkin Venables, Thos. Shirman, Jesse Shirman (Isaac?), Major Benjamin Handy, Sarah

Handy, widow, Captain George Handy, Coll. Isaac Handy, Wm. Winder, Ephraim King, Coll. John Henry, and The Reverend Mr. Henry (Hugh). The Somerset Court granted the Presbyterians permission to conduct regular services on Wicomico River on 12 March 1672. Scrogins, Caldwells, Collins and Polks were early members of Rockawalkin Presbyterian Church that was founded near Salisbury in 1683, under the direction of the celebrated Presbyterian minister, Francis Makemie. On 12 June 1706 Mr. John Hampton and Mr. George McNish were allowed by the province to preach at the meetinghouse on the land of Mr. Joseph Venables, the meetinghouse near Mr. Edgar's, the meetinghouse at the head of Manocan and the Meetinghouse at Snow Hill. The Venables site was near the Upper Ferry, which was operated by Captain John Handy. The meetinghouse in 1709 was located at Upper Ferry on Wicomico River. In 1742 the church was situated on Rockawalkin Creek (then called Mill Creek) about a mile and a half above Wicomico River near the gristmill of Captain George Paris. This mill has also been known as Hitch's Mill and Rockawalkin Mill. Pemberton Road now crosses the stream below a pond near this site. In 1767 the meeting house was further up the creek, near the present intersection of Rockawalkin Road and Route 349, about four miles west of Salisbury, south of, and visible from, the highway. The site of this third church, "the venerated Rockawalkin Meeting House," was on a tract of three acres, called Newberry, that was sold by Thomas Stanford, his wife Rachel and John Reid, all of Somerset County, for five shillings, to Isaac Handy and William Venables of Somerset and John Henry of Dorchester County for the purpose of erecting a Presbyterian meeting house. John Scrogin (D2), whose name was transcribed erroneously as Scroggia, is on an Honor Roll of Elders from 1750 to 1800, with Joseph Caldwell, William Venables, Benjamin Venables, Joseph Venables, Gillis Polk, James Polk, and others. The early ministers were Francis Makemie, 1683; George McNish, 1706-1709; John Henry, 1710-1717; William Stewart 1719-1734, Patrick Glascow, 1736-1741; William Robinson, 1745; John Hamilton, 1746-1750; Hugh Henry, 1750-1763; Jacob Ker, 1764-1795; and John Collins, 1796. In 1830 the meetinghouse was in Salisbury. 19

Joseph Scrogin (C1) was one of the many inhabitants of Somerset County who signed a petition to the Lower House of Assembly, before 27 October 1763, for a new charter which would encourage the settlement of the town of Salisbury. Other signers included John Jinkins, Joseph Jinkins, George Low, James Collins, William Venables, Joshua Venables and Benjamin Venables.

On 19 May 1766 Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County bought 100 acres of land called Anything from Robertson and Ann Lingoe of Worcester County, for 37 pounds, 10 shillings: 21

This Indenture made this ninteenth day of May in the year of Our Lord God one thousand seven hundred and sixty six between Robertson Lingoe of Worcester County in the Province aforesaid planter of the one part and Joseph Scrogin of Somerset County in the Province aforesaid planter of the other part Witnesseth that ... Robertson Lingoe for and in consideration of the sum of thirty seven pounds ten shillings current money to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents by ... Joseph Scrogin ... hath ... sold ... unto ... Joseph

Scrogin ... all that tract ... of land ... in Somerset County called ... Anything which is ... described as in ... the original grant ... containing one hundred acres ... In witness whereof the partys ... to this indenture interchangably their hands have set & seals affixed the day and year first above written.

Maryland, Somerset County: To wit be it remembered that on the day & year first within mentioned personally appeared ... Robertson Lingoe and Ann his wife ... and did acknowledge the lands & premises within mentioned to be the right & property of Joseph Scrogin ... May 23, 1766, Received of Mr. Joseph Scrogin the sum of four shillings sterling be in for an alienation for the within land.

The tract named Anything, bought by Joseph Scrogin, was surveyed on 15 May 1702 to Robert Caldwell, uncle of Sarah Caldwell Scrogin, as 100 acres between the Rockawalkin and Manokin rivers in Wicomico Hundred. 22

In 1723 John and Margaret Caldwell, son and widow of Robert, conveyed Anything, on the north side of Wicomico River, to Sarah's father John Caldwell, Jr. for love and affection. 23 John passed the tract to his son, and Sarah's brother, Joshua Caldwell, who directed that it be sold in his will which was dated 23 January 1758 and proved on 04 April 1758.²⁴ Joseph Scrogin (C1) was named as an advisor to the executor of the will. On 19 August 1762, as administrators of the will of Joshua Caldwell, Joseph Scrogin and Littleton Dennis sold Anything to Robertson Lingoe. 25

James Dashiell of Somerset County possessed 237 acres named Anything, which he left to son Christopher Dashiell in his will dated 16 February 1708/9 and proved on 14 March 1708/9 (Maryland Wills 12, page 232). John Collins of Somerset County, planter, sold 50 acres called Anything, which he bought from William Ralph on 08 June 1734, to Samuel Calloway for 5 pounds on 20 February 1762.²⁶

On 19 May 1766 Joseph Scrogin (C1) of Somerset County bought the tract Stains (Stanes or Stones) from George Hearn (Hern) of Worcester County, for 56 pounds. On 11 December 1745 George Hearn acquired the 150-acre parcel, adjoining Fairfields, from Thomas Hearn for 10 shillings. Stains came into the Hearn family from Thomas and Catherine Layfield. 28 Containing 850 acres, the tract Stains in Wicomico Hundred, four miles from the fork of the Rockawalkin, was surveyed for Colonel William Stevens on 10 April 1680. He conveyed the right to George Layfield from whom it passed to Samuel Layfield, heir to George Layfield and husband of Colonel Steven's widow Elizabeth. 29

Joseph Scrogin, Nehemiah Hearne and Isaac Handy witnessed the will of William Hearne, dated 11 June 1741 and proved on 20 January 1756, by which he left 175 acres of the tract Stains, including his dwelling plantation, to his son Elijah Hearne, and 150 acres of the tract to his son Isaac Hearne, with friends Benjamin Handy and George

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Hearn to divide the property. Later, in his will dated 04 March 1760 and proved on 07 April 1760, which was witnessed by Joseph Scrogin (C1), Elijah Hearn and Isaac Moore, Nehemiah Hearn bequeathed 125 acres called Stanes and 37 acres named Fairfields (Fearfields) to his eldest son Elisha Hearn, Jr. Next, Thomas Hearn left 150 acres of Stains, out of a tract of 420 acres near Coxes Branch, to James Hearn, son of William, in his will dated 27 January 1762 and proved on 26 March 1762. 30

Joseph Scrogin (C1) witnessed the will of Moses Calloway on 10 November 1758 which was proved on 21 March 1759. He witnessed the undated will of Joseph Leonard, which was proved on 05 May 1767. On 22 December 1768 he was a witness, with Joseph Venables and George Low, to the will of Mitchell Dashiell, which was proved on 31 January 1769. 31

Joseph Scrogin (C1) and Joshua Hatch made an inventory of the estate of Richard Stevens Bound in 1767. 32

On 10 November 1770 Joseph Scrogin (C1) was given power of attorney by Thomas Ralph, which empowered him to convey some land to William Ralph, on behalf of Thomas Ralph, on 04 December 1770, in the presence of Stephen Bailey and Davis Bailey. 33

Joseph Scrogin (C1) obtained a warrant for 105 acres of land called Hazard, in Somerset County on the north side of Wicomico River, between Fairfields and another parcel named Addition to Collins Adventure, on 23 April 1771. It was surveyed on 21 October 1771 and a patent was issued for it on 26 July 1783:34

Containing one hundred and five Acres more or less to be held of the Manor of Somerset this twenty first day of October Anno Domini 1771. August 3d 1772 Examined) and passed U Scott Exr.) p Arnold Elzey.

Addition to Collins Adventure contained 420 acres that were surveyed on 14 May 1688 for Nehemiah Covington, in Nanticoke Hundred at the head of the Rockawalkin. Collins Adventure, in adjacent Wicomico Hundred, on the north side of the main branch of Rockawalkin, was a 500-acre tract surveyed to Thomas Walker on 19 April 1680 and assigned to George Collins. On 12 June 1683 George Collins of Somerset County,

planter, and his wife Rachel, sold Collins Adventure to Nehemiah Covington, carpenter, of Somerset County, for 12,000 pounds of tobacco. Betty Collins who married Samuel Scrogin (D5) appears to have been a great-great-granddaughter of George and Rachel Collins, by way of John Collins and Gayner Walter; John Collins, Jr. and Sarah Bounds; and Joseph Collins and Sarah Boyce.

Joseph Scrogin (C1) died between 05 September 1772, when he wrote his will, and 27 February 1773, when his son John Scrogin (D2) proved it in Somerset County Court: 37

Contrary to his description as being of a fiery and undisciplined nature, ³⁸ Joseph Scrogin (C1) apparently was a literate and thoughtfully religious man because he possessed a library of serious reading that, as best as can be determined from the inventory of his

estate, included John Bunyan's allegorical *Holy War, Hymns and Psalms* of Isaac Watt, *Church Government* by Richard Baxter, *On the Affections* by Jonathan Edwards, 3 volumes of Davis' *Sermons*, 1 volume of Tennant's *Sermons*, Besset's *Abridgement*, a second book of Tennant's *Sermons*, 2 volumes of Harvey's *Meditations*, Wilavon's *Balm of Gilead*, Jenkins' *Submission*, Dandridge's *Rise and Progress*, Deadel's *Exposition*, *Truth's Victory Over Error*, *On Contemplation of the World*, *Collection of Psalm Tunes*, and 13 other books:³⁹

Deced. which were come to his hands at the time of the making thereof, and that what hath Since or Shall hereafter come to his hands possession or knowledge he will return it on Additional Inventory and that he knows of no Concealment of any part of the deceased's Personal Estate and if he shall hereafter discover any Concealment or Suspect any to be he will acquaint the Commissary General for the time being or his Deputy with such Discovery or cause of Suspicion that it ... (balance of document not in possession of compiler).

The confusing and inexplicable abbreviations that seem to be "e." and "te." appear to represent quantity, capacity and/or value. Several distinguished Maryland genealogists of wide experience were unfamiliar with the abbreviations and unable to interpret them for the compiler.

Joseph Scrogin, John Scrogin and Samuel Scrogin witnessed the will of George Parker on 26 February 1772, which was proved in Worcester County, Maryland, on 29 March 1772. His legatees were wife Abigail, who inherited two tracts of land, which at her death were to pass to daughters, Bette, Nelle, Sarah and Elizabeth, born of first wife; son Samuel, who inherited three tracts; and son Benjamin who inherited one tract. All children were minors. Brother Jacob Parker was named executor. The fact that three Scrogins were present when Parker made his will, suggests more than a casual relationship with the Parker family, but the connection has not been determined.

Robert Scrogin (D7) inherited a negro girl named Lucretia from his uncle John Caldwell III, by his will dated 28 March 1775 and proved on 25 April of that year. 41 On 16 May 1785 Robert Scrogin (D7) and his father-in-law Nathan Culver, both of Somerset County, sold parts of two tracts of land named Hazard and Addition to Collins Adventure to Joshua Hastings of Sussex County, Delaware, for 50 pounds. On 05 June 1790 Robert Scrogin (D7) sold to Joseph Scrogin (D4) for 30 pounds a parcel of land called Hazard in Somerset County, which had been granted to their father Joseph Scrogin and inherited from him by Robert. It was adjacent to a tract known as Supply, that was possessed by William Hearn, son of Elijah Hearn. 42 Robert Scrogin (D7) and his wife Ann Scrogin, daughter and heiress of Nathan Culver, late of Somerset County, deceased, sold to William McBryde of Somerset County, on 28 September 1790, for 174 pounds, 15 shillings, 233 acres made up of parts of three adjacent tracts of land in Worcester County, Maryland, known as Collins Adventure, Addition to Collins Adventure and Addition to Good Luck. Robert signed the deed but Ann subscribed to it with an X mark. They acknowledged it in Worcester Court on the date that the deed was made. 43

Samuel Scrogin (D5) was described as a resident of Somerset County on 16 May 1785, when he sold his legacy, the 100-acre tract Anything, to John Scrogin (D2) of Somerset County, for 50 pounds. Samuel acknowledged the deed in Somerset County Court on the same day. 44

On 11 May 1787 Philip Scrogin (D10) of Worcester County bound himself in the sum of 500 pounds and mortgaged his household goods and a tract of land, formerly belonging to John Talbot, to John Scrogin (D2), Robert Scrogin (D7) and Nathan Culver, all of Somerset County, in consideration of 5 shillings and their security on his behalf to Henry Trayder and others. On 24 May 1786 Philip Scrogin (D10) was described as a resident of Somerset County, when he bought 100 acres named Fort Neck from John Venable (Venables), for 5 pounds. Venable had taken the land from George Talbot by an attachment issued from Worcester County Court to cover a debt that Talbot owed him.

On 08 October 1790 John Scrogin (D2), planter of Somerset County, conveyed for 18 shillings, 9 pence, to Joseph Scrogin (D4), planter of the same place, two contiguous tracts of land named Hard to Come At, containing 135 1/2 acres, and Addition to Anything, containing 42 acres, which adjoined at the corner of the tract called Anything near the head of Maidenhead Branch. Both tracts had been patented by the province to John Scrogin, but there was a dispute between John (D2) and Joseph (D4) over the boundaries of the land. If the resolution of the misunderstanding found the land to belong to John (D2), then this deed was a quit claim in favor of Joseph (D4). John (D2) previously had sold part of both tracts, in a parcel containing 30 acres, to Eli Vinson. John Scrogin (D4) signed the deed and appeared in Somerset Court with his wife Eunice Scrogin on the same day to acknowledge it. 47

Eunice, the wife of John Scrogin (D2), has been identified as Eunice Jane Polk. The husband of Nancy Scrogin (D1) was James Polk. They married in Delaware. Mary Scrogin (D3) wed (1) Captain Revel Wharton and (2) William F. Boone. Samuel Scrogin (D5) wed Betty Collins. Samuel Davis who married Sarah Scrogin (D6) and James Davis who married Ann Caldwell Scrogin (D11) were brothers. Mildred Scrogin (D9) never married, after her lover was killed during the Revolutionary War. Matilda Scrogin (D13) married the Reverend Joseph Collins, a Methodist minister of Baltimore.

Matilda Scrogin (D13) did not marry Joseph Collins, until after 12 June 1793, when she was designated by her maiden name in the will of her brother Joseph Scrogin, Jr. (D4). The identification of Joseph Collins as a Methodist minister is curious, given the affiliation of the Scrogin and Collins families of Somerset County to the Presbyterian Church. John Collins was the minister of the Rockawalkin Presbyterian Church in 1796. Although the Reverend Joseph Collins has not been connected to the siblings, Betty Collins who married Samuel Scrogin (D5) and John Collins who married Bette Scrogin (D8), it seems reasonable to imagine that he was a relative and that he and Matilda were married on the Eastern Shore before going to Baltimore.

The second husband of Mary Scrogin Wharton (D3), has been identified as William F. Boone of Philadelphia and also as George Boone. A connection to the family of George Boone and Mary Mogridge, who emigrated from Devonshire, England, to Pennsylvania in 1717, has not been made. 50

The wife of Joseph Scrogin, Jr. (D4) can be identified as Elizabeth Brereton from his will, which also indicates that they had no children that survived him as heirs. In his will, dated 12 June 1793 and proved in Somerset County on 30 November 1793, Joseph Scrogin (D4) appointed his wife Betty and brother Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10), as executors. Among his heirs were niece Nancy Brereton and nephew Joseph Brereton, son of James Brereton of Worcester County. Since none of his siblings married a Brereton, the only way that Joseph could have a Brereton niece and nephew is through marriage to a Brereton. Other legatees were brother Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10), who was the principal heir, brother Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12), Matilda Scrogin (D13), Sally Davis (D6), Thomas Davis (E30), and Juliana Scrogin (E29). Witnesses were James Davis, Levin English and Daniel Game. Thomas Davis (E30) was a son of James Davis and Ann Caldwell Scrogin. Juliana Scrogin (E29) was a daughter of Philip Scrogin (D10) and Mary Keephart. 51

Philip Scrogin (D10) and Mary "Polly" Keephart were married by Anne Arundel County marriage license dated 10 August 1779. 52

Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) married Isabella Bohannon (Buchanan) on 11 August 1808 in Bourbon County, Kentucky. This is a late marriage for a man born in 1762 and may represent a second wife.

The sons of Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin have been described as "all over six feet in height and all were officers in the Revolution. They seemed to inherit the religious tendencies of their mother (Sarah Caldwell), who was of a French Huguenot family, grafted onto Scotch-Irish Presbyterians. Her descendants generally followed the latter faith." Captain John Scrogin (D2) was in the Revolutionary War. Samuel Scrogin (D5) and Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) were lieutenants during the conflict. Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) was an ensign in the Revolution. Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10) was a captain. Captain Revel Wharton, husband of Mary Scrogin (D3), was killed while operating his own ship. 54 Some of these statements cannot be proved by available military records and others are contradicted.

Revolutionary War service records for only four of the six sons of Joseph Scrogin and Sarah Caldwell have been discovered. John Scrogin (D2) is on a list dated 09 June 1777 of company officers nominated to fill vacancies in the 1st Battalion of Somerset County, Maryland. He was recommended for 2nd Lieutenant. Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) was an ensign of the 2nd Maryland militia in 1777 and was paid twice that year; collecting 6 shillings in continental currency and 4 pounds, 10 shillings in specie from the army at one time and 12 pounds, 15 shillings on another occasion. On Friday, 16 March 1781, Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10) was commissioned an ensign in Captain Robert Handy's Company in the Wicomico Battalion from Worcester County, Maryland. He collected 88 pounds, 13 shillings and 6 pence depreciation pay in 1783. Philip was killed during the War of 1812. As a resident of Franklin County, Kentucky, Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) collected a Revolutionary War pension as a private soldier, not a lieutenant, in the Maryland militia. He applied on 09 January 1833, aged 69, for a pension under the act dated 07 June 1832, which was retroactive to 04 March 1831. Born in Somerset County,

Maryland, on 24 July 1764, he enlisted in Somerset County in 1780 and lived in Delaware after the war before moving to Kentucky. 55

Described as aged 70, Thomas Clark Scrogin was placed on the pension roll on 11 February 1833, for an annual pension of \$45.55 and paid \$136.65. In applying for his military pension in Franklin County Court on 09 January 1833, Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) of Franklin County, Kentucky, aged 69, declared that he entered into Revolutionary War service in August 1780 as a resident of Somerset County, Maryland. At that time he became old enough to be placed on the muster roll and was called to duty as a militia soldier in the company of Captain Levin Irvin with Gilly Polk as 1st Lieutenant, James Henry as 2nd Lieutenant and Isaac Henry as Ensign. Part of Scott's Regiment and the brigade of General George Dashiell, the company was ordered by Colonel Scott to guard the mouths of Wicomico River, Back Creek and other inlets which Tories and other enemies used to enter the area and plunder Somerset County. Guard houses were erected at these strategic points and the company remained there under arms until October 1781, when Lord Cornwallis surrendered. The application was signed Thomas C. Scrogin. Under questioning by the Court, Thomas said that he was born in Somerset County, Maryland, on 24 July 1764 and that he had a record of his birth that came from his father. He testified that he was a resident of Somerset County when he went into service and later lived in Delaware, for some years, before moving to Kentucky in 1792, where he lived nearly all of the time in Franklin County. He stated that he was drafted for his first tour of duty, but continued in the service voluntarily. He reiterated that he served under General Dashiell and Colonel Scott and added that his unit also reported to Major Bailey. He declared that he had not received a discharge. John T. Edgar, a clergyman of Franklin County, and Joseph Brown of the same county attested to his identity, age and reputation as a soldier in the revolution. His pension record credits him with service as a private in the company commanded by Captain Irvin of the regiment commanded by Colonel Scott in the Maryland militia for 13 months and 20 days, beginning in August 1780.⁵⁷

Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10) was a bombardier in Captain Gale's Company of Maryland Artillery. He appears on muster and pay rolls of the unit from September 1779 until March 1780. He enlisted for the duration of the war and was appointed bombardier on 08 November 1779. During this tour the company was stationed at a camp near Chester on 09 November 1779 and at a camp near Morris Town on 07 March and 13 April 1780. The statement that Philip was killed in the War of 1812 probably is erroneous. He appears to have died before 23 July 1800, when his daughter Matilda obtained a license to marry James Self in Franklin County, Kentucky, with the consent of her mother Polly Scrogin. James Campbell was surety on the bond.

Two descendants of John Scrogin (D2) joined the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution against his Revolutionary War service as a sergeant in Captain Levin Irvin's (Irving's) Black Water Company of the Somerset County militia in 1778.

Descendants of Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) was accepted into membership in the NSDAR against his Revolutionary War service as an ensign in the 2nd Maryland Regiment in 1777. 62

It has been published that the eighth child of Joseph Scrogin and Sarah Caldwell was a son William, born on 24 April 1755, 63 but the family record of Joseph Scrogin (C1) identifies their eighth child as daughter Elizabeth, born on 26 April 1755, and does not include a son named William.

John (D2), Joseph (D4) and Robert (D7) Scrogin took oaths of allegiance in Somerset County in February 1778. John signed on the 14th and Joseph and Robert on the 21st. Since it is not recorded that Samuel (D5) and Philip (D10) made the oath it is probable that Samuel, at least, was living elsewhere. Married about 1773 to Betty Collins, whose family apparently resided in Delaware, Samuel may have been living there. Philip who was married in Anne Arundel County in 1779 may have been residing in that area in 1778 but at age 19, perhaps he was not required to sign. Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) was only 16 in 1778 and perhaps not required to take the oath.

John Scrogin (D2) and Eunice Polk moved to the part of Bourbon County, Kentucky, that became Harrison County. Mary Scrogin (D3) and Revel Wharton had a daughter, Sarah Wharton (E8), who married Elisha English of Kentucky. Samuel Scrogin (D5) and Betty Collins moved to Bourbon County, Kentucky. Sarah Caldwell Scrogin (D6) and Ann Caldwell Scrogin (D11) settled near Lexington in Fayette County, Kentucky, with their husbands, Samuel and Thomas Davis. Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) and Ann Culver moved to Woodford County, Kentucky. 65

The 1800 Kentucky tax list included James Davis and Thomas Davis in Fayette County; Thomas Scrogin (Scroggin) in Harrison County; Robert Scrogin in Woodford County; and John Scrogin and Samuel Scrogin in Bourbon County.

Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) died in Franklin County, Kentucky, before 25 January 1844 when his death was reported: 67

Scroggin, Thos., Revolutionary Pensioner, 80th yr., d. in Franklin Co. (25 January 1844)

This age corresponds to a birth year of 1764, as he gave on his pension application, but contradicts the family birth records, which showed 1762, probably correctly, since Matilda was born in 1764. Although his pension application also stated that he lived mostly in Franklin County, after coming to Kentucky, Thomas Clark Scrogin (D12) apparently moved to Woodford County after marrying Isabella Bohannon in Bourbon County in 1808. He was enumerated in Woodford County on the 1810 census as a family of 3⁶⁸ and on the Woodford County census for 1820 as a family of 4; one apparently being a son born between 1808 and 1810 and the other a daughter born between 1810 and 1820:

Eunice Jane Polk who married John Scrogin (D2) was a daughter of John Polk and Sarah Vaughn of Little Creek Hundred in Sussex County, Delaware. John Polk was a son of Ephraim Polk I and a grandson of Robert Bruce Polk (Pollack), from whom also was descended U.S. President James Knox Polk. Sarah Vaughn Polk was identified as a daughter of Joseph Vaughn whose son Joseph Vaughn, Jr. commanded the Delaware Continentals known as the Blue Hen's Chicks in the Revolutionary War at the battles of Cowpens and Camden. However the mother of Eunice Polk Scrogin may have be a daughter of William Vaughn, gentleman, of Somerset County, Maryland, whose will was dated November 1742 and proved on 14 January 1743. His heirs were his eldest daughter Sarah Polk, daughter Elizabeth Bacon, son Jethro (the principal heir), son Levin (Leven), son William and son Ephraim (Ephram), wife Mary and five small children. When Samuel Scrogin (D5) first visited Kentucky in 1786, he travelled with Ephraim Polk III and others from Sussex County, Delaware. Eunice Polk Scrogin was a legatee of her father whose will was dated 29 April 1782 and proved on 07 May 1788 in Sussex County, Delaware:

John Polk. Little Creek Hd. Will. Made 29 April 1782. Heirs: wife Sarah Polk; son William Polk; daus. Sarah Bacon, Elizabeth Sirman, and Eunice Scroggin; grandson William, John, and Josiah Polk (children of dec'd. son John). Exec'r. William Polk. Wits., James Cooper, Samuel Windsor, William Brown. Prob. 07 May 1788 (Arch. vol. A93, page 126. Reg. of Wills, Liber D, folios 181-182).

Betty Polk was married to Lowder Sirman of Sussex County, Delaware. William Polk married (1) Rachel Bell and (2) Leah Marshall. 74

The Bacon and Sirman (Serman or Sherman) families also were affiliated with the Collins family.

It has not been determined how James Polk who married Nancy Scrogin (D1) was related to Eunice Polk who married John Scrogin (D2). James was a brother of Josiah Polk, who willed him parts of three tracts, called Doe Better, Hoggs Down and Hopewell, in 1784, which James bequeathed to his wife Nancy in 1795. Another brother and legatee of Josiah Polk, in 1784, was William Polk. On 25 March 1807 John Done and his wife Patience sold to Josiah Bayley of Dorchester County, and Thomas Bayley of Somerset County, for 5 shillings, 1/3 part of Hoggs Down, which James Polk willed to his wife Nancy, and after her death to his brother William, sister Sinah Bayley and the children of his brother Gillis Polk. Sinah Bayley left her part to her daughter Patience Done. Sinah Polk was married to Esme Bayley. Josiah Polk was a son of David Polk, from whom he inherited land named Buttocking Ridge in 1778. In 1784 Josiah bequeathed parts of this tract to his brother James and sister Sinah Bayley. The Hoggs Down tract, which was acquired by David Polk in 1745, was also left to Josiah. David Polk was a son of William Polk, who gave him a tract known as Rich Land in 1739, which William acquired by patent in 1728. David Polk and his wife Betty sold it in 1760.

Captain Revel Wharton (1746-1776), who married Mary Scrogin (D3) in 1763 in Maryland, was a son of Thomas Wharton and Sarah Revel. He was born in Northampton County, Virginia. Revel Wharton owned and commanded a privateer in Revolutionary service during which time he was killed by the British. Later in Redstone, Pennsylvania, apparently on the way to Kentucky, Mary married George Boone or William F. Boone from Philadelphia, reputedly a relative of Daniel Boone, who died before the emigrants arrived in Kentucky.

John Collins who married Elizabeth "Bette" Scrogin (D8) was a brother of Elizabeth "Betty" Collins who married Samuel Scrogin (D5). John Collins was married first to Sarah Venable, daughter of William Venable and Mary Caldwell. In his will, dated 22 April 1787 and proved in Sussex County, Delaware, on 07 July the same year, John Collins made bequests to his three daughters Polly, Jenny and Margaret Collins (who were by his first wife), son Joseph Scrogin Collins, George Scrogin, son of Samuel, Samuel Scrogin, George Bacon and Sarah Anderson. Bette (D8) became the second wife of John Collins by June 1778 since their son Joseph Scrogin Collins (E36) was born on 17 March 1779 in Sussex County, Delaware. Some family records show that Bette Scrogin (D8) married John Collins on 10 May 1778 but, unless Elizabeth was living in Charles County, Maryland, with her relatives, that date seems questionable. The marriage of Eliza Scrogin (Scroggan) and John Collins by the Reverend John McPherson of Pyckawaxon in William and Mary Parish, Charles County, on 10 May 1778, 79 probably applies to a daughter of John Scrogin, Jr. (C2), one of the brothers of Joseph Scrogin (C1) who remained in Charles County. The other brother James Scrogin (C3) apparently had no children. Despite the name and year coincidence it is unlikely that Elizabeth "Bette" Scrogin (D8) and John Collins of the Eastern Shore went across Chesapeake Bay to Charles County to get married. Furthermore the military records for John Collins indicate that he was on active duty for the first 23 days of May 1778.

Betty Brereton, who married Joseph Scrogin, Jr. (D4), undoubtedly descended from William Brereton and Sarah Smith, who came from Northumberland County, Virginia, to Somerset County, about 1672 or 1675, and settled in the fork of the present day Wicomico and Passerdyke creeks, on 500 acres of Smith's Adventure, part of 1000 acres granted in June 1667 to Colonel Samuel Smith of Little Wiccocomoco in Northumberland County, Virginia. Smith deeded a full one-half of Smith's Adventure to William Brereton, his son-in-law, and his wife Sarah, for love and affection on 08 June 1672. William Brereton and Sarah Smith had William Brereton who married Diana -----, Hannah Brereton who married John Waltham, Judith Brereton who married Jonathan Raymond, John Brereton, Thomas Brereton, Henry Brereton, Sarah Brereton and Grace Brereton.

The first white man known to have visited the Eastern Shore of Maryland was Giovanni de Verrazano, the Florentine navigator sailing for the King of France. He and his men landed on the shores of Chincoteague Bay in 1524 and explored inland until stopped by the swamps of the upper Pocomoke. Verrazano entered his observations of the area and its Indian residents in his ship's log.

In 1607-1608 Captain John Smith explored the region, identifying various islands, rivers, straits and Indian habitations.

The first recorded white settler lived near Snow Hill in 1642 but the area did not begin to be heavily settled until 1661. The settlers came principally from elsewhere in Maryland, from Virginia and from England. From 1661 to 1666 the Eastern Shore of Maryland was known as St. Marys City. By 1663 land disputes began to arise along the Eastern Shore border between Maryland and Virginia causing the governors of the two colonies to appoint a commission to study the boundary in 1665. On 25 June 1668 an agreement was reached between Philip Calvert of Maryland and Edmund Scarborough of Virginia that established the dividing line between the colonies on the Eastern Shore. In the meantime, on 22 August 1666 Cecil, Lord Baltimore, Lord Proprietary of the Province of Maryland, issued a proclamation through the Honorable Charles Calvert, Governor of the Province, for the creation of Somerset County which originally included all of the Eastern Shore of Maryland from Nanticoke River south to Virginia. The southern boundary was described as "a line from Watkin's Point (being the north point of the bay into wch the River Wighco formly called Wighcocomoco afterwards Pocomoke & Wighcocomoco againe, doth fall exclusively) to the Ocean on the east." Eventually, "Old Somerset," as it was commonly called, was divided into three counties, Somerset, Worcester and Wicomico. It has been stated that Lord Baltimore established Somerset County to stimulate settlement and to solidify his claim to the area which was being encroached upon by settlers from Delaware under grants issued by the Duke of York. The county was named for Lady Mary Somerset, sister-in-law of Lord Baltimore.

The first colonists were members of the Church of England, followed by Scots and English Presbyterians. In order to admit Quakers who were expelled from Virginia, in 1670 the Lord Proprietor relaxed the prohibition against non-conformists such as Quakers, Unitarians, Jews and other non-believers in the divinity of Christ. Methodists settled here during the Revolution and Baptists came thereafter. Two religious leaders who made a lasting impression on Somerset County were Francis Mackemie and Joshua Thomas. Mackemie, a Presbyterian minister, came to Somerset and established a church at Rehoboth which was the first Presbyterian Church in America and the foundation of American Presbyterianism. Known as "Parson of the Island," Joshua Thomas, who was born at Potato Neck and buried at Deal's Island in Somerset County, was a remarkable and beloved religious leader in the bayside settlements of Delmarva Peninsula. Very few of the famous camp meetings were considered successful without the presence of Brother Thomas and his sailing canoe called The Methodist.

Worcester County was erected in 1742 from the eastern part of Somerset, beginning near the mouth of Pocomoke River, thence up the river to the headwater of Dividing Creek, then through Salisbury to Broad Creek Bridge which is now Laurel, Delaware. Southern Delaware was a part of Maryland until 1767, when the present Maryland-Delaware boundary was drawn. Snow Hill, the first town in the area of Worcester County, was chartered in 1686 and became a Port of Entry in 1694. Pocomoke City, originally known

as Stephen's Landing, and Berlin, once a small hamlet around Burleigh's Inn, were other early settlements.

Formed from parts of Worcester and Somerset counties in 1867, Wicomico County took its name from the river which flows through its center. It is the youngest county on the Eastern Shore and next to the youngest in the state. It is one of the four counties of Maryland to be erected by state convention. The state constitution adopted in 1867 stated:

Beginning at the point where Mason's and Dixon's line crosses the channel of the Pocomoke River, thence following said line to the channel of the Nanticoke River, thence with the channel of said river to Tangier Sound, or the intersection of Nanticoke and Wicomico Rivers, thence up the channel of the Wicomico River to the mouth of Wicomico Creek, thence with the channel of said creek and Passerdyke Creek to Dashield's or Disheroon's Mills, thence with the millpond of said mills and branch following the Counties of Somerset and Worcester, near the southwest corner of farm of William P. Morris, thence due east to the Pocomoke River, then with the channel of said river to the beginning ... then said parts of Worcester and Somerset Counties shall become and constitute a new County, to be called Wicomico: and Salisbury shall be the County seat ...

Salisbury was established in 1732, the same year as Baltimore, at a place called Handy's or Carr's Landing at the head of the (now) Wicomico River. It is interesting to trace the different jurisdictions under which the inhabitants of Wicomico have been placed in the years since the first settlements. Even before Wicomico became a county in 1867, Salisburians were not always sure of their heritage - part of the town was in Somerset County and the other in Worcester. Division Street (originally called Dividing Street), one of the principal streets today, was the boundary line. Those who lived to the east had their county seat at Snow Hill, Worcester County, and those to the west went to Princess Anne, Somerset County. Even today the lawyers of Salisbury (and genealogists) often find it necessary to do much of their research in the courthouses of both counties.

In 1684 controversies between Somerset and Dorchester counties over the settlers between Marshyhope Creek and the main branch of Nanticoke River resulted in the main branch of Nanticoke becoming the boundary between these two jurisdictions.

Poplar Hill mansion at the north end of Poplar Hill Avenue in Salisbury was built in 1795. All Hallows Episcopal Church in Snow Hill was erected 30 years before the Revolutionary War in 1745. The ruins of the Nassawango Iron Furnace are in Snow Hill, as is the Julia Purnell Museum. There are a number of old water grist mills throughout the Eastern Shore. Mardela Springs Mill, located 10 miles northwest of Salisbury on Route 50, is thought to antedate the Revolutionary War. The mill at Laurel, Delaware, and the Mardela Springs Mill still grind grain. There is a spring house, a health spa of early 19th century origin, in Mardela. An old Mason-Dixon Line marker, with the coats-of-arms of Lord Baltimore on the Maryland side and of William Penn on the Delaware side, is located just off Route 457 between Mardela and Delmar. Princess Anne, 12 miles south of Salisbury on Route 13, was the center of 17th and 18th century society and has a

wealth of early colonial structures, among them being the mansion built in 1801 by Littleton

Dennis Teackle, the Washington Hotel, constructed in 1744 by John Done, the Boxwood Gardens and other famous homes. Kingston Hall, located about 10 miles from Princess Anne at the head of King's Creek, was built in 1683 by Major Robert King. The old Lankford home in Lawson's District was erected about 1750. Clifton, on Manokin River, was constructed about 1700 by Randolph (Randall) Revell, Jr. on the site of his father's manor house on Revell's Grove, which was granted to Randall Revell in 1665. Workington, built in 1793, stands on Back Creek near its junction with Manokin River in Somerset County. Rehoboth Presbyterian Church, also known as Makemie's Church, erected in 1706 on the site of the first Presbyterian Church in the United States, which was founded in 1683, still stands in Rehoboth near Pocomoke City, 26 miles south of Salisbury. There is a tremendous Indian burial mound of prehistoric origin located near Parsonburg, 8 miles east of Salisbury, just off Route 50. Smith Island in Tangier Sound, 10 miles off-shore from Crisfield, has a fishing village that is virtually unchanged since being settled 300 years ago. Excursion boats visit Smith Island from Crisfield in the spring and summer months. Some of the grandchildren of Joseph and Sarah Caldwell Scrogin have been identified from various family records, correspondence and research: 83

John Mills Scrogin (F19), who died in 1853, and Mildred Scrogin Brown (F18) were dead by 1887 when a biography of Levin Polk Scrogin (F20) was published. At that time his youngest sister was residing in Chico, Butte County, California: 88

Levin P. Scrogin, a prominent and successful farmer and businessman of Lexington, first opened his eyes to light near Paris, Bourbon Co., Ky., on the 30th of March, 1823. His father, John Scrogin, was born in Maryland, and his mother, formerly Miss Patsey Mills, was a native of Virginia. John Scrogin was a farmer by occupation, and of Scotch parentage and ancestry, with an admixture of the German. John Scrogin went to Kentucky when a young man, and from there emigrated to Morgan County, Ill., with his family, in the fall of 1828, and located upon what it now the site of Jacksonville, where he died about two years later.

Our subject was of a family of two sons and two daughters, only two of whom survived - our subject, and his youngest sister, who is now a resident of Chico, Butte Co., Cal. He was but six years of age at the time of his father's death ...

Mr. Scrogin was married in 1848, to Miss Sarah E. Holmes, who was born in Morgan County, Ill., and was the daughter of Paris Holmes, of that county. Her mother was formerly Miss Lois Sweet ... Mr. Holmes was born in Connecticut and his wife in New York ...

The family of our subject consisted of nine children, of whom five are still living: Arthur J., Austin H., Carrie E., Charlie P. and Emma L; the other died in infancy. Both parents and children are members of the Baptist Church. Mr. Scrogin has served as Justice of the Peace ...

His mother Martha "Patsy" Mills may have provided his German ancestry, since the Scrogin, Polk and Caldwell families do not to appear to have any Germanic connections.

Martha "Patsy" M. Scrogin (F21), who was born in June 1825 in Kentucky and died on

20 March 1904 in Chico, California, married Sebastian Jefferson Cecil, son of Phillip Cecil and Polly Wygal, on 14 October 1841 in Henry County, Missouri. Sebastian Cecil was born in Montgomery County, Virginia, on 04 August 1819 and died in Chico, California, on 01 July 1900. Sebastian and Patsy Scrogin Cecil had nine children, as listed in the subsequent family group sheet, and apparently moved from Missouri to California about 1858, between the birth of Thomas in Missouri in 1857 and the birth of Marcus in California in 1859.

Joseph Scrogin (E6) and Nancy Jane Holmes had nine known children. Nancy was born on 20 August 1783 and died on 08 December 1846 at Bruceville, Busseron Township, Knox County, Indiana. Joseph and Nancy Jane Holmes Scrogin are buried in Ockiltree Cemetery with all of their children except one, who was interred in Bruceville Cemetery. 90

The issue of Samuel Scrogin (E3) has not been determined and it is not known if Sarah Ann Caldwell Scrogin (E5) was ever married. 91

Calvin Brown was a teacher and a Presbyterian minister. He taught at Pittsville school #107 "a neat frame building on the east half of section 26," in Johnson County, Missouri. In May, 1866, the family moved to Mt. Hope (later Odessa), Missouri. He traveled extensively in the course of his ministry. During his ministry in Oregon, he also taught for a while in Oregon to augment his income. He died from a chronic kidney infection on 05 August 1921 in Houston, Harris County, Texas, and was buried there, in Hollywood Cemetery, on 07 August 1921.

Calvin and Mary Brown apparently returned to Texas in 1913 because the 1938 death certificate of his widow, who was described as a housewife, stated that she lived in Houston the last 25 years of her life. Mary Yancey Brown fell at her home, at 109 East 26th Street in Houston, on 08 May 1938 and fracturing her left femur at the hip. John Lial Scrogin (F15) and Rebecca Parker were married in Woodford County, Kentucky on 26 October 1843 by W. H. Whittington (Scrogin Scroggin Scroggins). John Lial Scrogin was an overseer on the farm of Colonel Hart in Woodford County, Kentucky, who was a slave trader, and Rebecca Parker was a daughter of William Parker, who used slave labor on his farm in Woodford County. John and Rebecca were listed with their older children on the 1850 Federal Census of Kentucky in Franklin County: 120

Milton Thompson Scroggin was appointed guardian of his sisters' interest in a tract of land in Franklin County in 1867, perhaps as the result of their father's second marriage which may have occurred about this time: 123

To the Franklin County Court

As guardian of Frances Toll Vienna Scroggin Josephine Scroggin Mary Catherine Scroggin and Martha Scroggin I report that the only estate of any kind owned by said wards is a tract of 18 acres 2 roods and 25 poles of land lying in Franklin County above the mouth of Cedar Run which is worth about \$25 per acre. Jno. L. Scroggin the father of said infants has a life estate in said land as tenant by the courtesy and is entitled to the rents of the same

Cedar Run roughly parallels Highway 420 and empties into the Kentucky River immediately south of Frankfort.

John Lial Scroggin was enumerated on the 1870 Federal Census of Kentucky in the Bald Knob District of Franklin County with his third wife Martha Grimes and his two youngest daughters by Rebecca Parker: 124

This record was tabulated on 03 August 1870 and indicates that John's second wife Ruth Grimes had died, that he had married her sister Martha before that date and that Martha's two children by John were born afterward.

On 05 July 1861, at the age of 18 (actually 16 1/2), Milton Thompson Scroggin joined the Confederate Army. He enlisted for the duration of the war as a private in Captain R. J. Breckinridge's Company, 2nd Regiment, Kentucky Mounted Infantry, which subsequently became Company B, 2nd Regiment, Kentucky Mounted Infantry, and traveled 273 miles from Lexington, Kentucky, to Camp Boone in Montgomery County, Tennessee, where he reported on 08 August 1861. He was captured at Fort Donelson, Tennessee, on 16 February 1862. Fort Donelson National Military Park and Cemetery is in Stewart County, northwest of Nashville, on the Cumberland River. Thompson Scroggin was a prisoner of war at Camp Morton, Indiana, until 24 August 1862, when he was sent to Vicksburg, Mississippi, for a prisoner exchange. He returned to duty with Company B, 2nd Regiment, Kentucky Mounted Infantry, the same month and served in that unit as a private until the end of the war. He was wounded at Chickamauga and fought at Missionary Ridge, Lookout Mountain and Nashville. After General Sherman overwhelmed the Confederate forces in Georgia, Thompson surrendered at Washington, Georgia, in Wilkes County between Athens and Augusta, on 06 May 1865. On 17 June

1865 he took the Oath of Allegiance to the United States with a group of Confederate officers and enlisted men at Nashville, Tennessee, and allowed to return home. On the Oath, his place of residence was shown at Franklin County, Tennessee, instead of Kentucky. He was described as 5 feet, 10 inches tall with a fair complexion, light hair and grey eyes. 125

On 14 January 1871 Thompson Scroggin and a colored man named Strother Trumbo had an altercation which resulted in the death of Trumbo near the south end of the tunnel in Frankfort. Scroggin was arrested and held without bail for trial in the United States District Court which had jurisdiction in cases where Negroes were killed by whites. On 27

February 1871 an armed band, estimated to be 150 men who were Confederate sympathizers, broke into the jail and freed Scroggin, who left town. He remained out of the county for several years, becoming an officeholder in another county. Forty years later, he described the event, "It was about twelve o'clock at night when someone took me

roughly by the arm and said, 'get up from there we want you.' Some fifteen or twenty men were in the jail, they did not permit me to put my clothes on and I was hurried away without any clothes except my night shirt. I thought at that time it meant death at the end of the rope. I was carried across the St. Clair street bridge and down near the city school where a large number of men were congregated. They gave me a new suit of clothes, a hundred dollars in money, a good horse, saddle and bridle and some good advice, all of which I appreciated. It took me a very short time to get out of the county." 126

During his absence from Franklin County, Thompson Scroggin lived in Kansas where he worked on a ranch and became acquainted with the James brothers and Cole Younger. In later years he regaled his grandchildren with tales about his experiences. He described Jesse James as a mean, scheming man of small stature who would steal from anyone. Jesse was afraid of his brother Frank James with whom he argued constantly. One night, while Thompson was staying at a hotel, a man entered the room to share it with him. A tall slim man in a dress suit with a long, pin-striped coat, he introduced himself as Cole Younger and warned Thompson not to startle him during the night. He was a hunted man and would shoot at the slightest provocation. He was carrying a shotgun and, when he removed his coat, he was wearing a pistol on his hip and two of them strapped around his chest. He put two of them under his pillow when he went to bed. Thompson said that he never slept a wink that night. 127

When he returned to Kentucky in 1882, Thompson Scroggin purchased a farm in Shelby County and, applying the knowledge he gained on the ranch in Kansas, became a successful breeder and tobacco farmer. He was a vigorous man until his death at age 93, with a full beard and an erect posture. He was buried in a replica of his grey Confederate uniform. 128

On 18 October 1882, M. T. Scroggin, a farmer of Shelby County, Kentucky, married Laura E. Washburne, age 22, also of Shelby County. It was his first and her second marriage. They were married at the home of John Jesse before witnesses, W. S. Scroggin

and B. L. Hieatt. The groom was born in Franklin County, Kentucky, and his parents were natives of Woodford County, Kentucky. William Samuel Scroggin (G60) and Milton Thompson Scroggin (G88) were third cousins.

Milton Thompson Scroggin probably was named for Milton Thompson who married Mildred Scrogin (F41), daughter of George (E11), in 1838.

John Scroggin (G94) was a heavy drinker. His wife left him and took their only daughter to Indiana. $\frac{130}{100}$

The parents of Martha "Patsy" Mills have not been determined but she may have been a daughter of Thomas Mills who died in Fleming County, Kentucky, in 1799, leaving, among other children, a minor daughter named Martha. Since Patsy was described as from Virginia, she probably was a cousin of the sisters Narcissa and Polly Mills who married the brothers Robert Scrogin (E10) and George Scrogin (E11). Sarah Emmeline Holmes, who married Levin Polk Scrogin (F20), was a daughter of Paris Holmes and Lois Sweet. They settled in McLean County, Illinois, in January,1849, where they were members of the Baptist Church and he was a Justice of the Peace. He donated an acre of land for the old Scrogin (Scroggin) Cemetery near Lexington in 1850. When a cholera epidemic swept the area, he gave burial plots to friends and the burial ground soon was filled. The bodies of the Scrogin family were moved to the Porteus Cemetery, about a mile west, which later was renamed the Lexington Cemetery.. Levin Polk Scrogin (F20), Arthur Judson Scrogin (G1), Austin Holmes Scrogin (G2), Charles P. Scrogin (G3), Emma Scrogin Covey (G4), Austin Harold Scrogin (H93), John Mills Scrogin (H94), Levin P. Scrogin (H97), Rose Scrogin (H98) and Constance Scrogin (H99) are interred in the Lexington Cemetery. Preston Brown (F7) and Mildred Scrogin Brown (F18) also are buried there.

JOSEPH H. SCROGIN is a son of John H. and Lucinda (Bruce) Scrogin, who were natives of Kentucky and Indiana, respectively, and born in 1809. In early life the father came to this neighborhood, where he grew to manhood and was married May 5, 1835. He followed agricultural pusuits and assisted in the early Indian wars. He died March 3, 1848 and the mother February 21, 1870. Our subject was born in Knox County in 1836. In boyhood he had almost no opportunities for schooling, but on reaching manhood he worked his own way in school at Ladoga, Ind. In 1861, at the breaking out of the war, he enlisted in Company H, Fifty-first Indiana Infantry, and of seventeen months' service over half was spent in the hospital with rheumatism. He was honor-ably discharged, and returned home and clerked for Roberts & Baird in Bruce- ville. Some two years later he tried farming, but finding his physical strength insufficient he abandoned farming and for over two years was disabled by rheumatism. In 1879 he set up for himself in the mercantile business in which he has since engaged. In 1866 he was married to Nancy J. Gano, born in Knox County in 1837. They have five children, viz: Mattie B., Lucinda M., George W., Anna and Rosie. Mattie is one of the rising teachers of the county. Husband and wife, and two eldest children are members of the Christian Church. Mr. Scrogin is a warm Republican and cast his first vote for Lincoln. He is a good business man and one who bears the confidence of all.

Della Scrogin Brown (H305) gave her granddaughter Ruth Brown (K431) a beautiful china doll on her 15th birthday which was her favorite treasure. The doll clothes were

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made by Della's Aunt Sara, who had not been identified otherwise but probably was a maternal aunt. Ruth wrote the history of the doll, as explained by her grandmother: [Genealogical data of Ruth E. Blankenbaker (K431) <rbanken@doe.state.in.us> 02 Nov 1999.]

The Scrogins were living in Moweaqua Township in Shelby County, Illinois, in the late 1890's and it seems as though the two presidential candidates were to make whistle stops through their county.

The 1896 election must have been a hotly contested one between the Populists, who fielded William Jennings Bryan, and the Republicans who supported William McKinley.

My great-grandmother Ida Dickinson Scroggin was a staunch supporter of McKinley. My great-grandfather, John Allen Scrogin was "campaigning" for William Jennings Bryan. Both parents wanted to win over their 7-year-old little girl, Della, and so they pried her with incentives.

Mother Ida promised Della a brand new dress if she would yell for McKinley when he made is stop through Shelby County, Illinois.

Father John promised his little girl that he would buy her a doll if she would yell for his candidate, Bryan.

It really was no contest: Della had always longed for a doll. And so, when William Jennings Bryan stood at the back of the train on his campaign trip through Shelby County, Illinois, Della yelled and yelled and yelled her little lungs out, not really caring about the politics of it all, for she wanted to make sure she got her doll.

True to his promise, her father found a way to buy the doll. He loaded up a wagon full of corn and made an all-day trip into town, trading the corn for the most beautiful doll in the world.

My grandmother always prized this special doll, and I can remember it forever hanging by a string around its neck on my grandmother's dining room wall. You can imagine how much I treasure it -- especially since my own father handmade a case out of black walnut wood from my maternal grandfather's land. The doll, with the clothes that were made my "Aunt Sara", now sits front and center high up on a plant shelf in my home. It is surrounded by other treasured items my grandmother Della Scrogin passed on to me, her first granddaughter.

Other treasured items she made me are the two or three quilts she made. I can still picture her sitting at her quilting loom -- a relic I believe my cousin, Russell Brown, inherited.

My sister, Doreen, has my grandmother's dining room set, complete with the chairs we always sat on for Sunday dinners. She has other treasured items throughout her home as well.

My grandmother was such a dear, sweet and kind woman -- and my, what a meticulous housekeeper she was!

Elisha English, who married Sarah Wharton (E8), was a son of James English, who lived near Laurel in Sussex County, Delaware, where he died in 1804, and his first wife Amy Threlkeld Waller. James married (2) Rachel Collins, by whom he also had children. Rachel Collins English has not been connected to the family of Betty Collins who married Samuel Scrogin (D5) but she probably was a close relative since two of the sisters of James English married into the Calloway and Given families.

Elisha English was born on 02 March 1767 in Sussex County, Delaware, and died on 07 March 1857 in Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky. Elisha and Sarah Wharton

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English moved to Kentucky in 1790 and went to Carrollton, Illinois, in 1830, where she died on 27 November 1849. Elisha and Sarah had fourteen children. 149

Nancy Wharton English (F80) married her cousin Nathaniel Culver Scrogin (E16), son of Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) and Ann Culver, and had six children. The middle name of Nancy English Scrogin (F80) is given as Waller in one place and as Wharton in others.

Elisha Gale English (F79) was born on 23 March 1798 and died on 14 November 1874. He married Mahala Eastin (Easton) and moved to Indianapolis, Indiana, where their son William Hayden English (G80) was born on 27 August 1832 and died on 27 February 1896. He married Mardulia Jackson and had a son William Eastin English (H740), who was born on 03 November 1854, and a daughter Rosalind English (H116), who was born on 11 September 1855. She married Dr. Willoughby Walling in 1876 and had two children born in Louisville, Kentucky. Rose English Walling (H116) collected considerable genealogical material about the Scrogin family which is in the W. H. English Collection at the Indiana Historical Society Library, of which some was published. 151

William Eastin English (H740) married Helen Orr and had a daughter Rosalind English who was born on 10 March 1903 and died on 22 December 1924. She is buried in the English family plot in Crown Hill Cemetery in Indianapolis. Situated on a round knoll in Section 1 of the cemetery, the English graves are marked by a cluster of fourteen headstones around a tall, white Grecian column. The illustrious careers of William H. English (G80) and his son Captain William E. English (H740) are described in detail on the pedestal of the column. The western side of the base is inscribed, "Rosalind Orr English, only child of William E. English (H740) and Helen Orr English, taken at the age of 21 years in the flower and beauty of her youth and on the threshold of a brilliant career." Her headstone, which is decorated with sea shells and stones from her rock collection, bears the dates of her birth and death. Nearby a smaller stone reads, "Mother of Rosalind." It does not contain her name nor the dates of her birth or death but is inscribed with a verse of poetry. 152

Helen Orr was a twenty-five-year-old divorcee when she met William E. English (H740) in 1898. He was forty-four. They were married in the same year and a month later he joined the army to fight in the Spanish-American War. When Captain English came home as a decorated war hero, he learned that Helen had been having affairs with several men during his absence. He filed for divorce and Helen married one of her lovers, Leroy Wegman, eleven days later. Not long afterwards, she divorced Wegman and returned to a forgiving Will English. They remarried and Rosalind Orr English was born in 1903. Marital problems continued and they divorced again in 1910. In response to the pleas of their the daughter, they were reconciled once more in 1924. Just before Christmas, that year, Rosalind was killed in an automobile accident. Will English grieved so much that his health failed and he died a year and a half later on 29 April 1926.

Helen English established a journalism award on 16 January 1928 and the top prize winner on the following 07 February was Frank J. Prince, a reporter on the *Indianapolis Times* who had served several terms in prison for grand larceny and bad checks. Born Morris Czech, he was instrumental in exposing political corruption in Indiana that brought a Pulitzer Prize to the newspaper. On 24 March, Helen English announced her engagement to Prince and they were married in Baltimore, Maryland, on 10 April. They honeymooned in Atlantic City, New Jersey. He was forty-eight and she was fifty-five. The *Indianapolis Journal* observed the event with the headline, "Prince New Consort of the Merry Widow of Captain English." The article began with part of a nursery rhyme:

"Fiddle Dee Dee, Fiddle Dee Dee The Fly Has Married The Bumble Bee!"

It ended with, "Also, society is wondering whether Helen and her husband will return to Indianapolis and attempt to establish, jointly, title to the social recognition which wealth and association with an honored family once vouchsafed to the handsome lady with so many lovers."

This marriage was also turbulent and the couple were divorced in Scott County, Indiana, on 21 October 1929. Shortly afterward they married again. They moved to Chicago, where Prince was employed by the *Herald and Examiner* and associated with the underworld. Al Capone and his men were allowed to use the English summer home, "Heart's Ease by the Lake," near Traverse City, Michigan, for vacations during the period 1928-1932. Helen also had an apartment in the English Hotel on Monument Circle in Indianapolis and a country estate named Englishton Park in Scott County. In 1931 they went to California and toured Panama and several other countries in Central America. Nevertheless, Helen suffered from severe depression and insomnia. On 29 May 1932 she and Frank flew to California on their way to Hawaii for an extended trip. On 16 June she took a massive overdose of sleeping pills in her room at the Biltmore Hotel in Los Angeles and died in a hospital six hours after Frank discovered what had happened.

Frank Prince brought Helen, who was born about 1873, back to Indianapolis, where she was interred beside her daughter in the English plot at Crown Hill Cemetery on 22 June. Frank inherited \$50,000 and the summer home near Traverse City. He sued for the entire estate, valued at \$3,000,000, but lost. The bulk of the estate went to the English Foundation, which was the major philanthropic organization in Indianapolis, of which Prince was named as a director. It was reported that there was a great deal of bitterness between the English family and Frank Prince.

Not long after Helen's death, Frank married Elizabeth Mueller and went to Chicago where he opened an advertising agency. They had a son Frank C. Prince in 1935. Two years later they moved to New York, where he became a private investigator and started the National Match Book Company. In 1939 he bought controlling interest in the Universal Match Company in St. Louis and built it into a large industrial firm that became the largest manufacturer of coin-handling machines. They also built machines

that sold pari-mutuel racetrack tickets. By 1960 Prince was a multi-millionaire, whose stock in Universal Match was valued at \$63,000,000. He kept a home in Washington, DC, and worked in public relations with the government. He served as a "dollar-a-year" consultant to the administration of President Eisenhower. As a philanthropist he made bequests to Washington University in St. Louis where Prince Hall and Prince Plaza were named for him. He also made donations to Brandeis and Brown universities. When the announcement of his \$500,000 donation to Washington University was made, his criminal history was publicized. He readily admitted that he had served more than nine years in

Indiana and Illinois prisons but his family was disgraced and ostracized by St. Louis society. The board of directors of Universal Match Company asked him to retire but the Chancellor of Washington University stated that he knew of Prince's background and that it made no difference in accepting his gifts and honoring his contributions. Frank went on to found the Lion Match Company in New Jersey and built another successful business. He died in 1977.

For many years, Frank Prince returned to Indianapolis annually to place roses on the grave of Helen Orr English Prince. 153

Two of the daughters of Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) and Ann Culver apparently were born after their marriage in 1778 and before 1783 when he was entered on the tax list for Rewastico District, Somerset County, as 1 white male, 3 white females and assessed for 326 1/2 acres: Hazzard, 9 1/2 acres; and Cottmans Adventure, 317 acres. 157

Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7) of Woodford County bought 220 acres of McDonnells Military Survey on the waters of Shannons Run there from William and Ann Hayden of Fayette County for 440 pounds on 03 March 1795. Robert (D7) and his family attended Pisgah Presbyterian Church which was established in 1784. Situated on Shannons Run Road, about a mile from the highway between Versailles and Lexington, the church building erected in 1818 is still functional. Many of the family are buried in the cemetery at the church. The death date of Robert (D7) was entered into the church records, along with various other entries pertaining to his family.

Sarah Scrogin (E17) is shown with one son named Ebenezer¹⁵⁹ but her will, in which she left the land upon which she lived in Woodford County near Pisgah Meeting House to her

sister Elizabeth Scrogin and Samuel C. Scrogin, indicates that she was never married. Dated 29 December 1835 the will freed her slaves and bequeathed funds to aid in taking them to Liberia, if they were interested in going to Africa.

Mildred Scrogin (E19) and Henry Davis had six children. Ann Scrogin (E22) and Richard Collins had two children. Elizabeth Scrogin (E23) never married and died at the home of Hiram Davis. Millie Sutton Bradley who married Samuel C. Scrogin (E24) was a daughter of Robert Sutton and his wife the widow Hannah Johnson Montague. Millie was married first to Philip Bradley. It is not known if Johnson Scrogin (E25) married or had children. He was dead by 10 March 1835 when his share of his father's estate was sold in one of several Woodford County deeds by the heirs of Robert Caldwell Scrogin (D7). Julia Scrogin (E26) and Hiram Davis had seven children. The relationship between Hiram Davis and Henry Davis who married Mildred Scrogin (E19) has not been determined. 161

The obituary of Mary Elizabeth Scrogin Brown (F93) indicates that her family moved to Illinois in 1834:

Mrs. Mary Brown, aged 94

She Came From Kentucky on Horseback When She was Sixteen

As briefly noted last week, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Brown died Febr. 17, at the home of her grandson, E. B. Brown, in Kane town. Mrs. Brown had passed her 94th birthday a month before her death, and was perhaps the oldest person living in Greene County.

Mrs. Brown was the daughter of Nathan and Nancy Scroggins, and was born in Olden (sic) County, Kentucky Jan. 18, 1818. When she was 16 years of age she came from Kentucky to Carrollton on horseback. accompanied by her grandfather, Elisha English. She was married to Elisha Brown March 1, 1837. Mr. Brown took his bride to his farm, the old Brown homestead, which continued to be her home during the remaining seventy five years of her life. Mr. Brown died in 1851. For the past seventeen years Mrs. Brown has made her home with her grandson, Edward B. Brown, who has been living on the place during that period.

Eight children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Brown, five of whom are living. There are Samuel E. Brown of Carrollton, Mrs. Nancy Scruby of Kansas City, George Brown of Greensburg, Kansas, Mrs. Adarine Ashford of Keysport, Ill. and J. Stanley Brown of El Centro, Cal. There are also fourteen grandchildren, twenty four great grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Fifteen months ago Mrs. Brown fell and broke her leg and she had been confined to her bed from that time till her death. She was tenderly cared for by her daughter, Mrs. Ashford. Besides her relatives, she leaves a host of friends who will cherish her memory. [Carrollton, Illinois, *Patriot*, 29 Feb 1912, transcribed by Patricia Donohue O'Boyle (L62)]

The descendants of Robert Culver Scrogin (E20) spelled their surname Scroggins. Sidney Terrell who married Robert Culver Scrogin (E20) was a daughter of Archibald Terrell and Virginia Sarah Hutchinson who were married in Orange County, Virginia, and moved to Woodford County, Kentucky, in 1807. Robert and Sidney Terrell Scrogin lived on a farm near Midway in Woodford County. Robert stated that he was born in 1790 at Georgetown, Maryland, while his family was en route to Kentucky. Georgetown became part of the District of Columbia and the 1860 census shows Robert Culver Scrogin (Scroggin) as having being born in the District.

Robert C. Scrogin, aged sixty-two, signed his name that way twice on 17 April 1852, when he appeared in Fayette County, Kentucky, Court to swear that he served in Captain Virgil McCracken's Company in the Rifle Regiment of Kentucky Volunteers commanded by Colonel John Allen in the War of 1812. He was mustered into service at Georgetown, Kentucky, about 15 August 1812 and, a few days later, marched to join the Northwestern Army commanded by Generals Harrison and Winchester. About 01 November 1812, General Winchester directed that some pirogues or canoes be constructed for the carriage of provisions and baggage downriver to the Rapids of the Maumee. Robert was among the men detached to build the vessels at a location about six miles downriver from Fort Defiance, where they cut down large poplar trees and dug them out. In moving the heavy boats to the river, one of them fell on Robert's left ankle, breaking bones, damaging ligaments and tearing away flesh. He was crippled so badly that he was sent home. The resulting permanent injury made it very painful to use his foot and, as he got older, it disabled him from following his trade as a blacksmith. Robert's claim was substantiated by statements from two physicians, William B. Cromwell, a military surgeon, and Douglas L. Price, his personal doctor, as well as by two fellow soldiers, Anderson Brown of Marion County, Missouri, and Reuben Ford of Woodford County, Kentucky, who joined the army with Robert and were with him from the rendezvous at Georgetown until the time of the accident. 166

"R. E. Scroggin and S. A. Scroggin" enlisted in the Confederate Army as privates on 02 September 1862 in Woodford County, Kentucky. They served in Company A of the 5th Cavalry Regiment, Kentucky. [Civil War Research Database, Ancestry.com, Inc., 1998.] Robert Ebenezer Scroggins (F51) was injured fatally, when a shell fell near him and his brother, who was wounded seriously. Sarah Anne Scroggins (F48) and Susan Terrell Scroggins (F49) went to Chicago in June of 1864, with Robert A. Rusk of Scott County, Kentucky, to claim his body and arrange for its return to Pisgah for burial. Sarah never married and resided with her sister Susan in her later years. She died in Cynthiana, Kentucky, but is buried in the Pisgah Cemetery in Woodford County. Susan Scroggins Haviland (F49), whose husband was a judge in Cynthiana, resided there, where she died and was buried in Battle Grove Cemetery. Reuben Lewellen Scroggins (F50) died of cholera on the way to California in 1849. He was buried beside the Oregon Trail, on the south side of the North Platte River, midway between Chimney Rock and Courthouse Rock, about five miles west of Bridgeport, Nebraska. A companion, Jeremiah V. Craine, notified Robert Culver Scroggins of Reuben's death in a letter written on 31 August 1848 after Craine arrived in Sacramento, California. Robert Ebenezer Scroggins (F51) was a Confederate cavalryman in Morgan's Raiders. A member of Company A, 5th Kentucky

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Cavalry, under General John Hunt Morgan, he was captured and imprisoned at Camp Douglas near Chicago, Illinois. He was stabbed to death there, by an assailant who has not been identified, and buried in the prison yard. Soon afterward, his sisters Sarah and Susan obtained passes through the Union lines and went to the prison to arrange for the exhumation of his body which was shipped home to Midway in a metal casket for burial in Pisgah Cemetery. The express company mishandled the shipment and the lost casket was eventually recovered from a dump heap in Covington, Kentucky, and finally arrived in Midway. 167

Dr. Francis Marion Scroggins (F47) was educated at Pisgah Academy ¹⁶⁸ before attending the medical school at Transylvania College from 1843 to 1844. His college thesis in 1844 was entitled *An Inaugural Dissertation on Puerperal Fever*. ¹⁶⁹ That year he left Kentucky, with his horse, medical books and a few .personal belongings, and travelled by boat to Glasgow, Missouri. He set up his medical practice at Switzer's Mills, about seven miles north of Glasgow and later resided in Salisbury, Missouri, where he and his wife are buried in the Salisbury Cemetery. Mattie Switzer Scroggins was a daughter of David Switzer, who was born in Frederick County, Maryland, and Christena (Schohorn?) who probably was a native of Rockingham County, Virginia. ¹⁷⁰

Rebecca Virginia Gunn was a daughter of Thomas Gunn, Jr., a native of Caswell County, North Carolina, and Susan Obedience Ellington, a native of Owensboro, Kentucky, who were married in Salisbury, Missouri, on 08 February 1844. ROBERT H. SCROGIN was born in Lexington, Ky., October 22, 1810, of parents Joseph and Martha (Campbell) Scrogin, natives of Kentucky and Pennsylvania. 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Bacon; Isaac Horsey and Shiles Moore. It was witnessed by Thomas Scrogin, George Purvis and Jude Oneil. 179

Perhaps Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10) only had two daughters, who apparently were born after his marriage in 1779 and before 1783 when he was entered on the tax list for Wicomico Hundred, Worcester County, Maryland, as 1 white male and three white females. He was not charged for any land. 180

Philip Jenkins Scrogin (D10) reputedly died during the War of 1812, in which he served as a captain, however, unless he was living apart from his family in Kentucky, he apparently died before 23 July 1800, when his daughter Matilda Scrogin (E28) and James Self got a marriage license in Franklin County, Kentucky, with the consent of her mother Polly Scrogin. 181

Polly Keephart Scrogin died in Kentucky. 182

James Self and Presley Self were brothers. James Self and Matilda Scrogin (E28) had a son Philip Jenkins Self (F89), from whom descended Virginia Easley DeMarce (K58). 183 The parents of James Self, who married Matilda Scrogin (E28), and Presley Self, who married Julianna (Julia Ann) Scrogin (E29), have not been proved but they undoubtedly were sons of Charnock and Elizabeth Self who came to Kentucky from Virginia by 1785: 184

Charnock Self, b.c. 1750 -- d.c. 1834/35, Gallatin Co., Ky. There does at least seem to be general agreement that the Charnock Self who shows up in Fayette-Scott-Gallatin-Owen Cos., Ky., was the son of Thomas and Elizabeth (Jenkins) Self of Fairfax/Loudoun Cos., Va. He must have married for the first time in Virginia, probably about 1778/79, but at least prior to 1780. This marriage was followed fairly promptly by the birth of three sons, probably in Virginia. Charnock appears in Fayette Co., Ky., as early as 1785. The first wife may have died, as apparently there is a gap in the list of children between 1785/1791. If there was a second marriage, it would probably have taken place in Fayette Co.,

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Ky., about 1789/90, before the beginning of the currently extant listings of Fayette Co., Ky., marriages. On the other hand, this gap is not so large that it could not be accounted for by two or three children who died young. By 1796, he appears in the records with a wife named Elizabeth ______, who must have lived at least until the birth of his last child in 1797. This Elizabeth cannot be the same woman as his eventual widow Betsy/Elizabeth Brent (to whom he was married prior to 1829, probably in Scott Co., Ky. -- extant Scott Co. marriages begin in 1837), however, as Betsy Brent left no heirs of her body. He apparently died between 6 February 1834 and 11 July 1835 in Gallatin Co., Ky. Anne Holder Lee and I agree that any hope of identifying the prior wife/wives of Charnock Self will probably depend upon a line/by/line reading of the Fayette Co., Ky. Court Orders and other surviving records.

James Self, the earliest proven ancestor of the Self family of Boone County, Missouri, resided in Fayette, Gallatin, and Scott counties, Kentucky, and Greene and Morgan counties, Illinois. He was born about 1775 or 1780 and died between 1835 and 1846. He

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married Matilda Scrogin (E28), daughter of Philip Jenkins Scrogin and Mary "Polly" Keephart on 23 July 1800 in Franklin County, Kentucky. She was still living in 1846 when her son James Davis Self (F132) made his will in Boone County, Missouri, but had died "long since" by 1879 when the probate of his estate was concluded.

Cornelius Hoagland, who married Julia Self (F131), was a son of Oakley Hoagland and Annie Voorhees. He was born about 1804 in Woodford or Franklin County, Kentucky, and died after 1872 in Hickory County, Missouri. They lived in Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois, in 1850. In 1880, Julia (F131) was living in Cass County, Illinois, with her daughter who had married a Tinsley.

The marriage of Martha Withers Black and Philip Jenkins Self (F89), on 07 December 1827, was recorded in both the Black and Self family Bibles, which were possessed by Mrs. William H. Easley of Columbia, Missouri, in 1988. Martha was born on 13 January 1805 (the same day as her husband) in Fauquier County, Virginia, and died on 24 March 1890 in Boone County, Missouri. She was a daughter of John Black and Rebecca Davidson.

Eliza Black, whose marriage to James Davis Self (F132) on 04 October 1827, also appears in the Black family Bible. Born on 14 August 1809, Eliza was a sister of Martha Withers Black who married Philip Jenkins Self. James Davis Self (F132), who was born on 13 May 1810 in Fayette County, Kentucky, died on 12 February 1868 in Boone County, Missouri, where he was buried in New Liberty Cemetery, "aged 52 ys, 8 ms, 28 ds." James and Eliza had no children who grew to adulthood. After James' death, Eliza Black Self married (2) Edmond Walter Forbis, on 03 September 1868. He was a son of George Forbis and Mary Perrigan, born on 16 June 1811 in Fayette County, Kentucky. Eliza Black Self Forbis died on 09 February 1879.

James Short, who married Eliza Self (F133) about 1830 was a son of Purnell Short and Jane Butler. He was born on 08 November 1808 in Kentucky and died on 08 July 1871, aged 62 years, 9 months, and was buried in the Mt. Gilead Cemetery near Woodville, Greene County, Illinois. After the death of Eliza Self Short (F133) about 1832, James moved to Greene County, with their only child, about 1833. He married (2) Millie Stone, daughter of Thomas Stone, and (3) Cynthia Wood Rice, a widow. By his three wives, James Short had eleven children.

Purnell Short, father of James Short and widower of Jane Butler, married (2) Sally G. Black, daughter of James Black and Rebecca Davidson, on 17 July 1828, probably in Scott County, Kentucky. Thus James Short's stepmother was a sister of his brothers-in-law, Philip Jenkins Self (F89) and James Davis Self (F132). Sally Black Short was born on 17 February 1807 in Kentucky.

The marital record of Charnock W. Self (F134), whose middle name probably was William, according to naming patterns in the Self family, is confused. He married Nancy H. Case [Cox?] on 17 November 1842, in Jacksonville, Morgan County, Illinois. Nancy was born on 17 August 1824 in Indiana and died on 09 October 1886 at Hamilton in

Hancock County, Illinois, where she was buried in Oak Grove Cemetery in Montebello Township. The cemetery, which lies across the road from Golden's Point Christian Church, also goes by the name of Golden's Point. Charnock W. Self (F134), who died in 1907, was interred there, too. However the 1850 census for Hancock County lists Charnock with a 32-year-old woman named Mary, who was born in Ohio, in residence. Perhaps the entry was meant to be Nancy, but she was born in Indiana in 1824 and would have been only 26 in 1850.

The parents of Elizabeth Slatter, who married John C. Self (F135) on 24 June 1841, have not been identified. John, who resided in Morgan and Cass counties, Illinois, was born on 12 September 1816 in Gallatin County, Kentucky, and died at Virginia in Cass County, Illinois, on 22 September 1892.

William Self, who lived in Morgan County, Illinois, in 1879, may have been a brother and heir of James Davis Self since he signed a letter which is in James' probate file. However he is not mentioned otherwise in the probate of James' estate, nor elsewhere as a son of James Self and Matilda Scrogin. Perhaps the signature was of Charnock W. Self. In the Illinois branch of the family, the initial W with the name Charnock, usually seems to stand for William.

Jonathan Eads was surety on the bond and testified that Presley Self was of age when Presley and Julianna (Julia Ann) Scrogin (Scroggins) (E29) were married on 12 May 1813 in Fayette County, Kentucky. Presley stated on the bond that he sometimes signs his name as Preston Self. The marriage was performed by the Reverend Robert Marshall of Scott County, Kentucky. 186

The Reverend Mr. Marshall began preaching about 1818 at the Bethel Presbyterian Church in Fayette County, about 7 1/2 miles from Lexington, off Leestown Pike. A list of "members in full communion" which appears in the session book dated 1823, includes Mrs. Presley Self and the "Widow Scroggin." This location is near Scott County.

Since she was associated in the church with the wife of Presley Self, the "Widow Scroggin" probably was Presley's mother Polly Keephart Scrogin.

After living in Fayette, Scott and Gallatin counties, Kentucky, Presley Self moved to Morgan County, Illinois, about 1831. He was still residing there in 1846.

The parents of Sarah Abraham (Abrams), who married James Harvey Self (F136), have not been determined. She was born on 18 February 1823 in Lexington, Kentucky, and died on 15 January 1897 in Morgan County, Illinois. James H. Self (F136) and his family lived on their homestead in Section 27, North of Jacksonville in Morgan County, Illinois, for five years, then went to Greene County, Illinois, for two years. They returned to Morgan County then and located on land purchased east of Woodson. 188

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The parents of Susan (Susannah or Sarah) Martin, who married John Presley (Preston) Self (F137), on 25 January 1838 in Morgan County, Illinois, are not known. John Presley Self (F137) died before 06 April 1847 when his widow Susan Martin Self married (2) James A. Black.

Mary Ann Self (F138) was born in Fayette County, Kentucky, and married William Ragan between 09 and 13 November 1837 in Morgan County, Illinois. The parents of William Ragan have not been determined. The death certificate of Mary Ann Ragan (F138) states that she died on 15 September 1908, age 87 years, 3 months, 6 days. She was born on 09 June 1821 in Kentucky and lived in Illinois 77 years. She was a housewife and widow when she died at Virginia, Illinois. She is buried in the Walnut Ridge Cemetery in Virginia according to records in the Cass County courthouse in Virginia, Illinois. 189
