Jennifer Roderer recently performed Waltraute in the Lyric Opera of Chicago's *Die Walküre*, which she also sang with Seattle Opera, covering Fricka and Waltraute in other Ring operas. At NYC Opera she performed Jade Boucher in *Dead Man Walking* and the Third Lady (*Zauberflöte*). She performed Amneris (*Aida*) at Opern Air Gars (Austria) and Opera Illinois; she has sung many opera roles throughout the U.S. She will sing Act II of *Parsifal* with the Los Angeles Philharmonic in 2003. Her concert repertoire includes Beethoven's *Missa solemnis* and the 9th, *Messiah*, and Mozart's *Requiem*. She received an Opera Index award and grants from WSNY and the Sullivan Musical Foundation. "[Her] plush mezzo commanded attention in excerpts from the Ring and *Tristan*." (*Baltimore Sun*)



Patrick Marques made his Houston Grand Opera debut in 2001 as Walter in *Tannhäuser*; he also performed the role with Tulsa Opera. His professional debut was as the High Priest in *Idomeneo* (Santa Fe Opera). He recently sang Sam (*Street Scene*), plus a recital and a concert of German operetta at the Wolf Trap Festival. Forthcoming U.S. engagements include Der Wirt (*Rosenkavalier*), Dr. Caius (*Falstaff*), Tamino (*Zauberflöte*) and the title role in *The Damnation of Faust*. He has numerous concert credits and will be the tenor soloist in Beethoven's 9th (his Carnegie Hall debut) in January. He is the 2002 recipient of the Society's annual Robert Lauch Memorial Award.
